The vaunted Mexia BlackCats invaded Bruce Field Sept. 22 and defeated the fighting HORNETS 13-0 in a closely contested game.

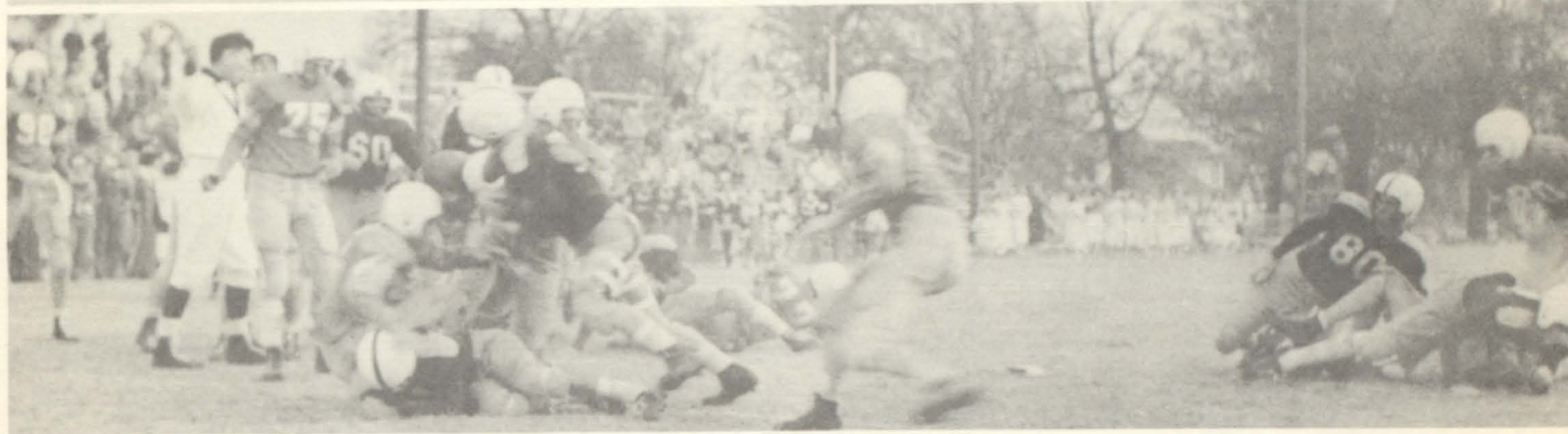
