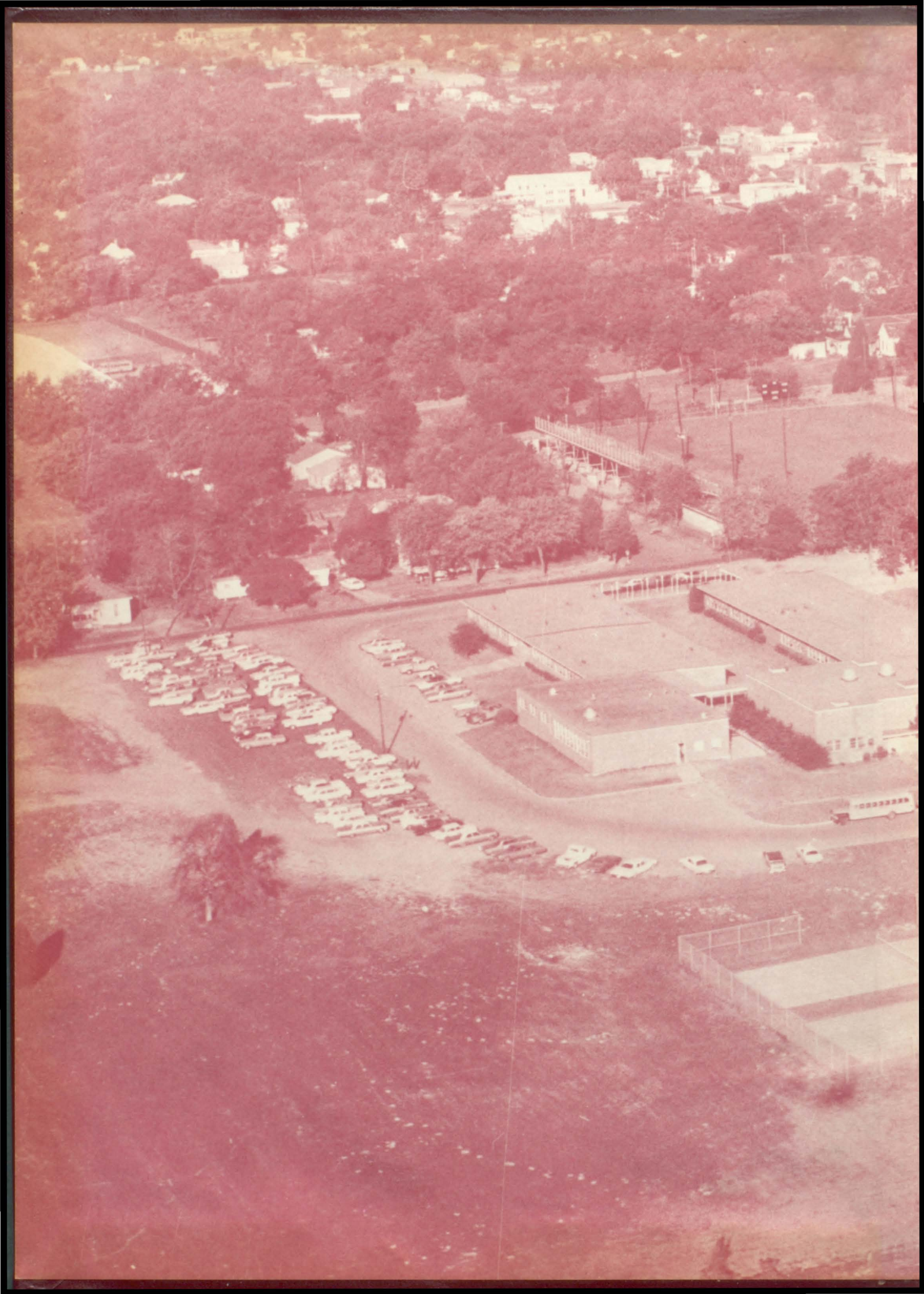


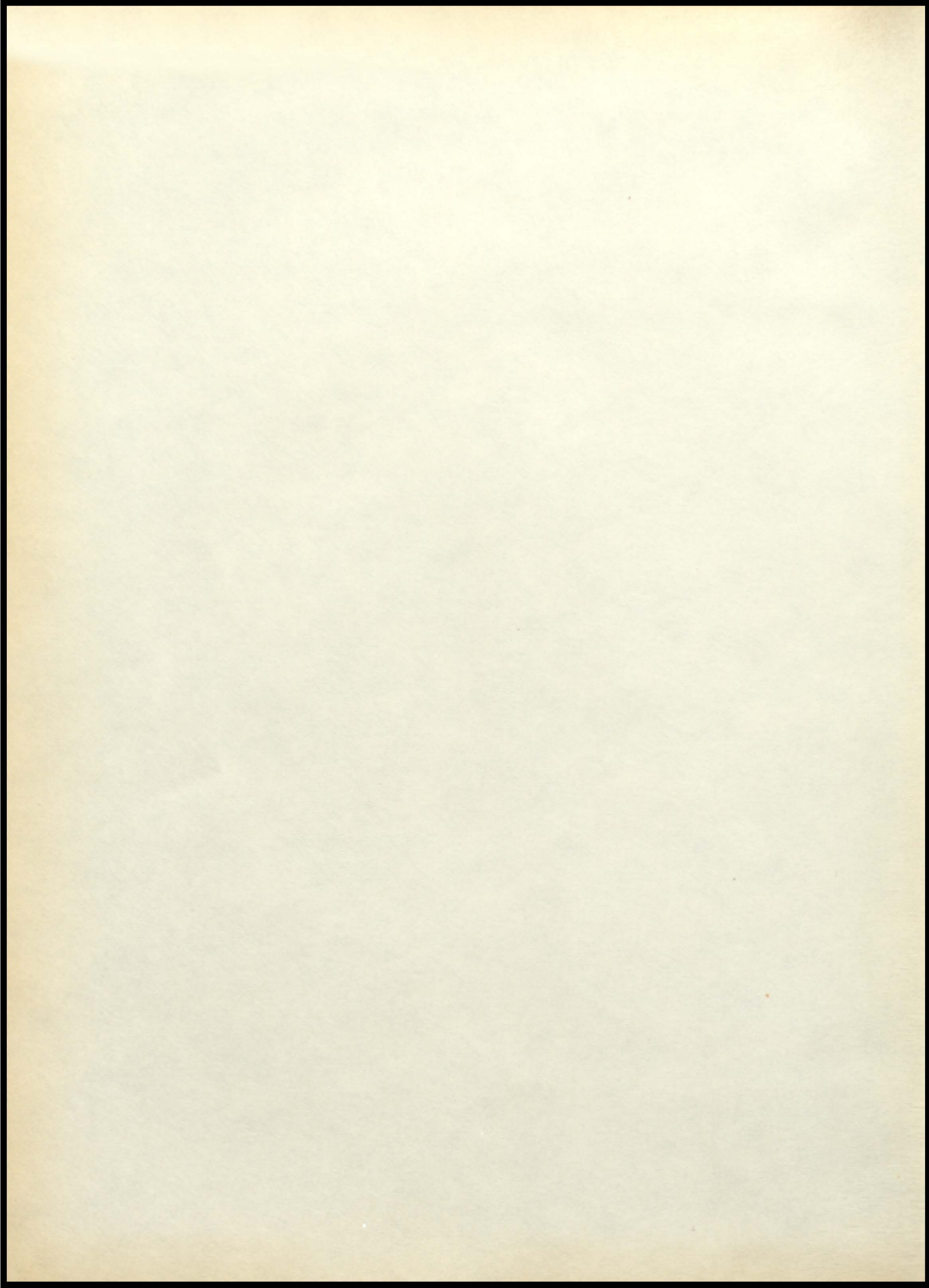

Mapping out the program the school is to follow is the job of the administration. They must devise a system under which the school can function in harmony.



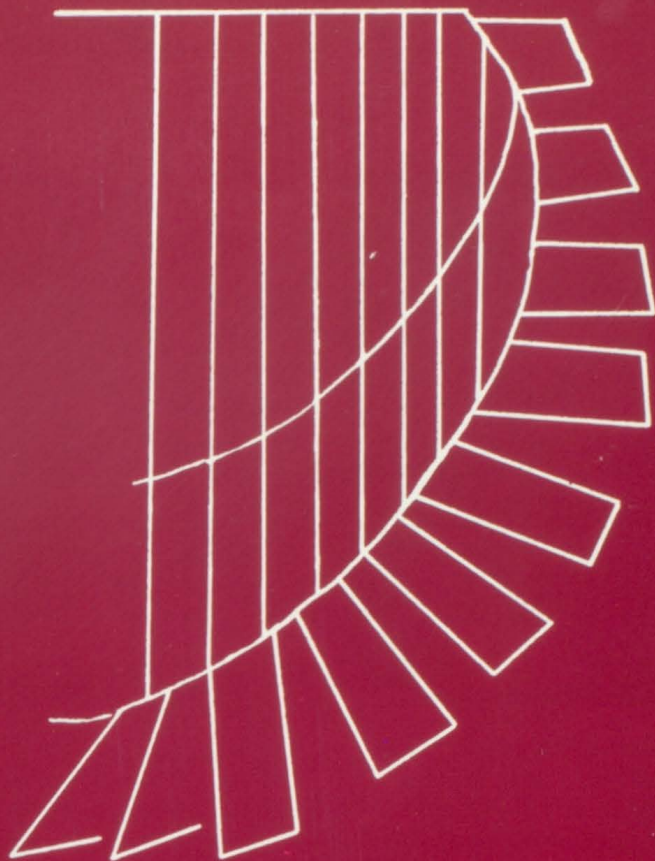

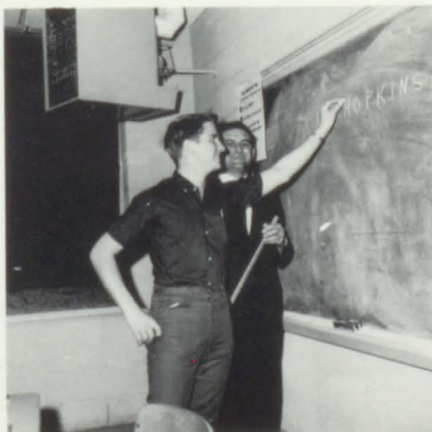

Distributive Education and Industrial Cooperative Training are offered to AHS students. The student must be 16 yrs. or older and a junior or senior. 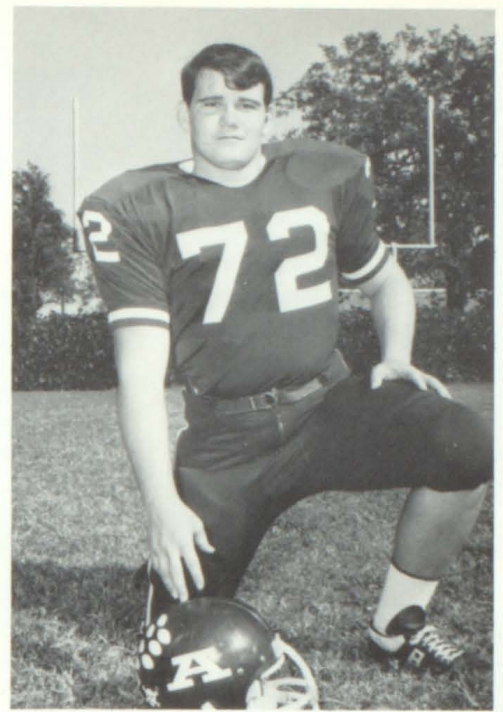


HORNETS MOVE INTO STATE PLAY-OFFS

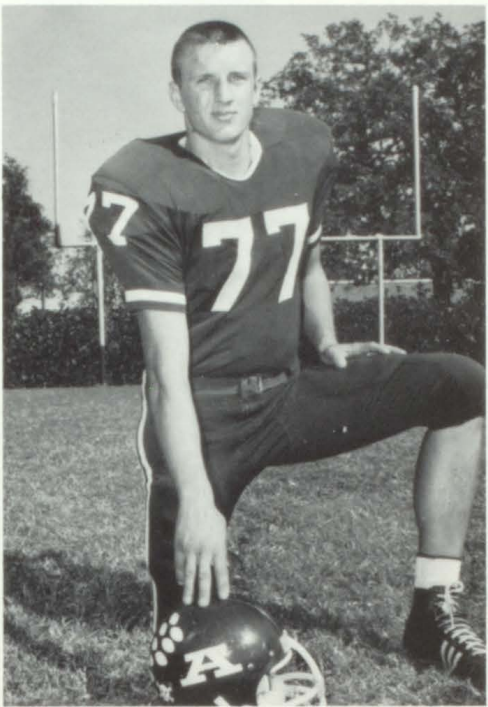

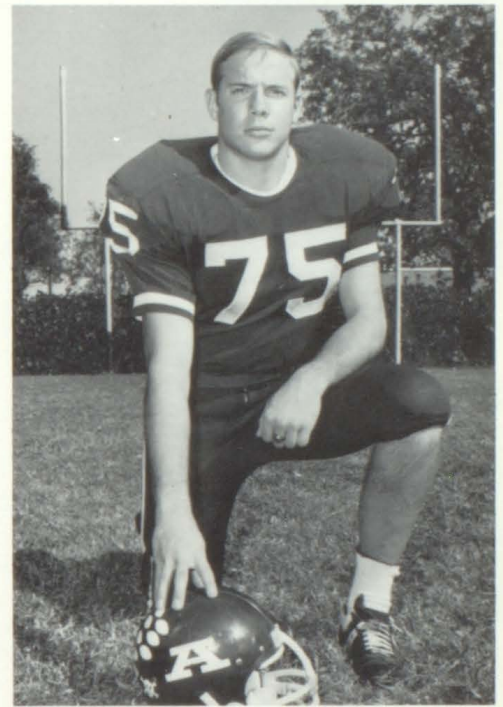

WILDCATS OUTSCORE HORNETS 36-28

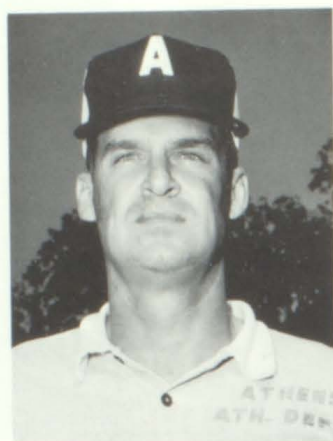

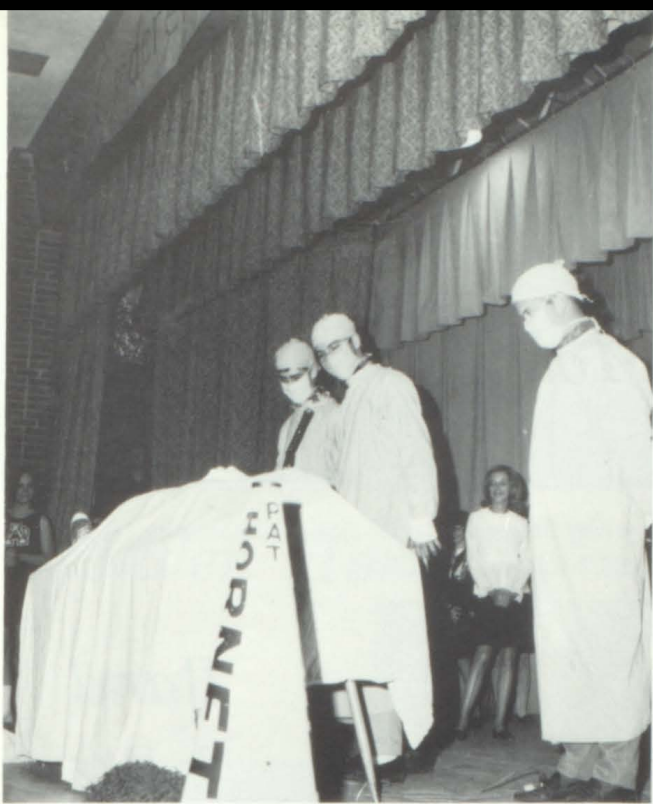
Downtown pep rallies gave an extra boost to Hornet spirit.

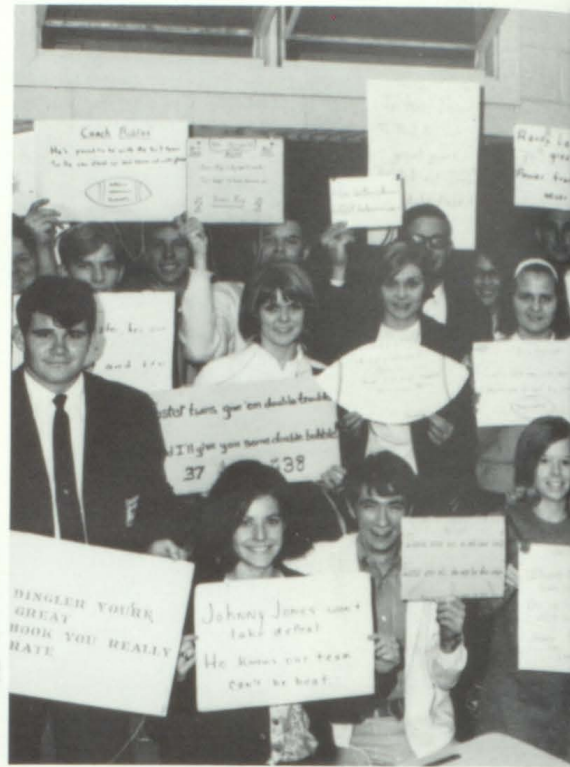

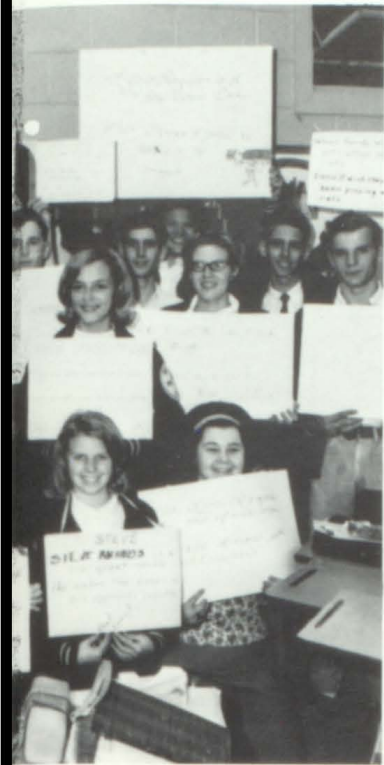
