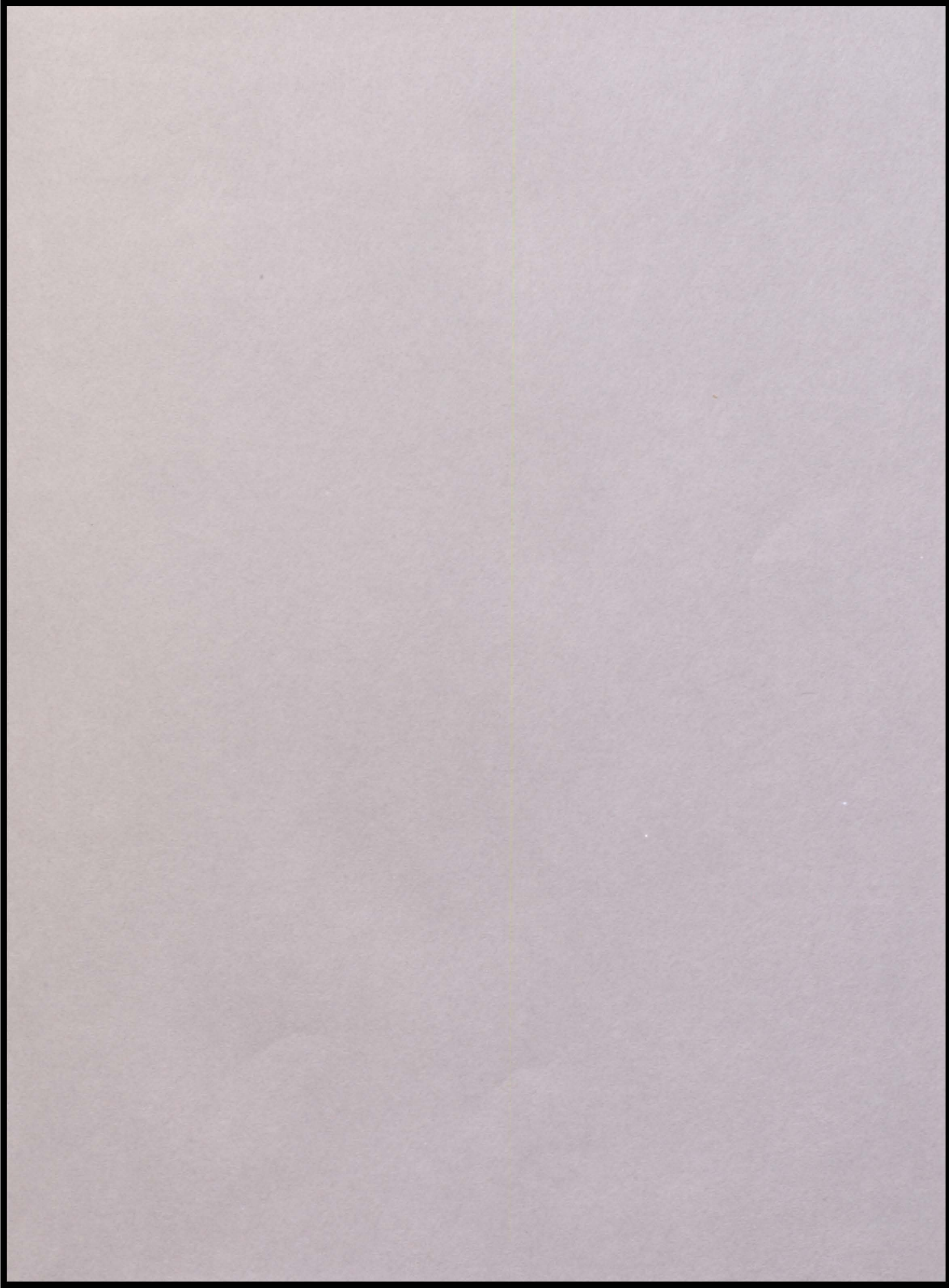


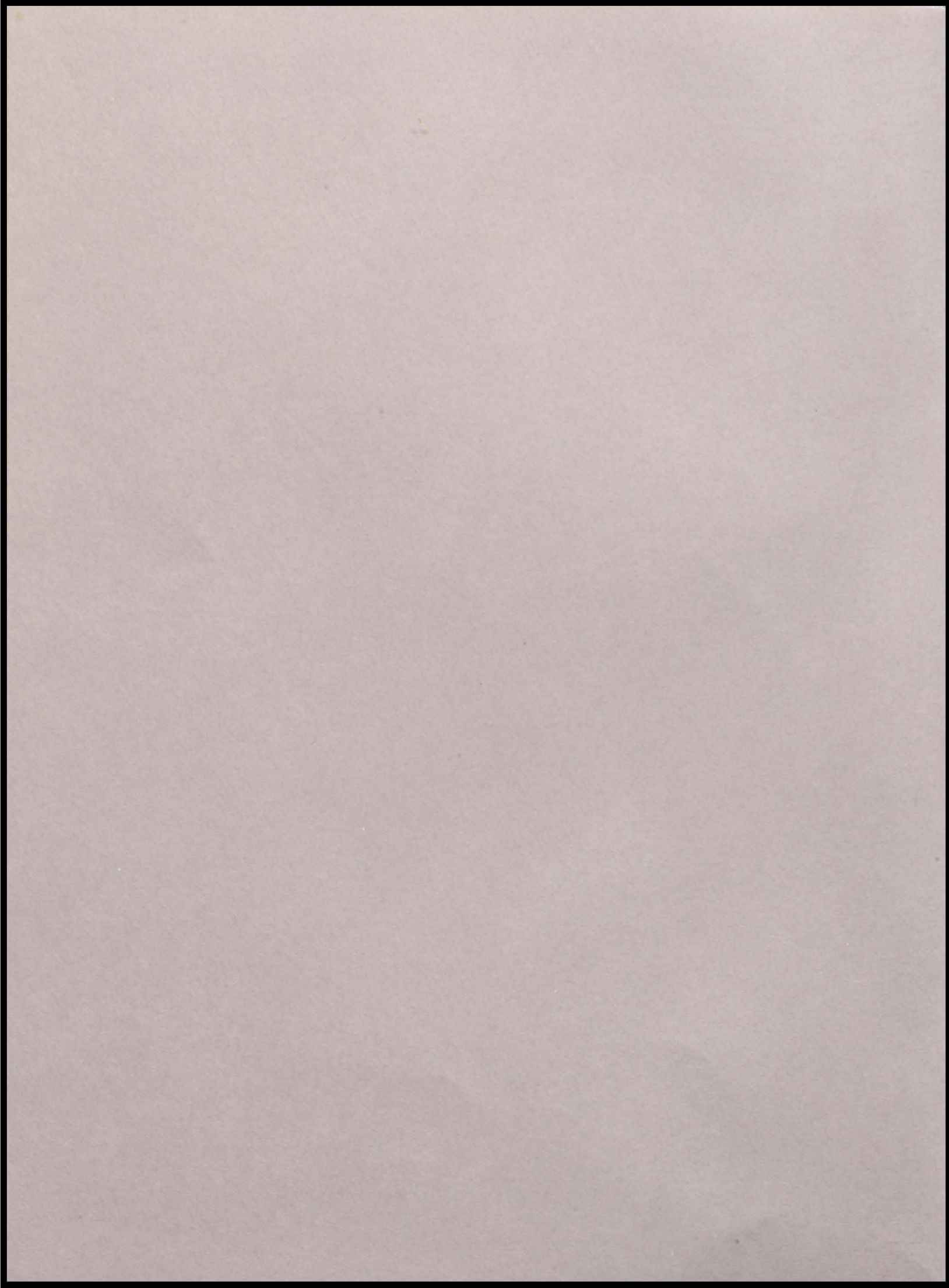

David Hodges tries to explain the philosophy of a corn chip to Cory Barron.

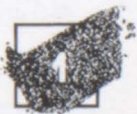

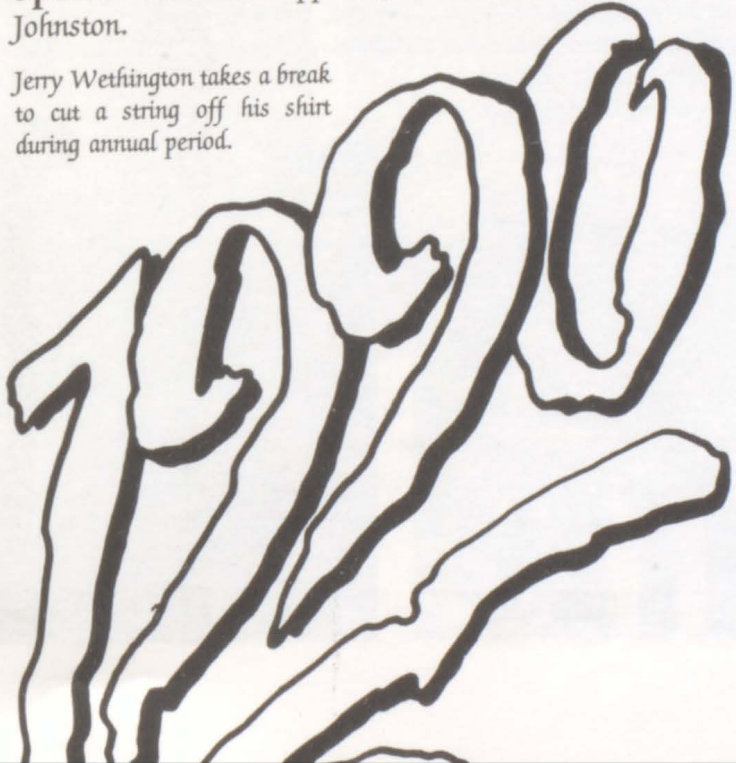
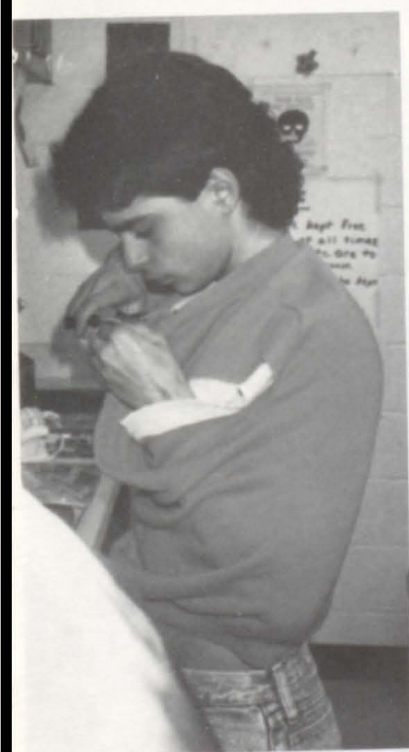
— WILL WE EVER FINISH?



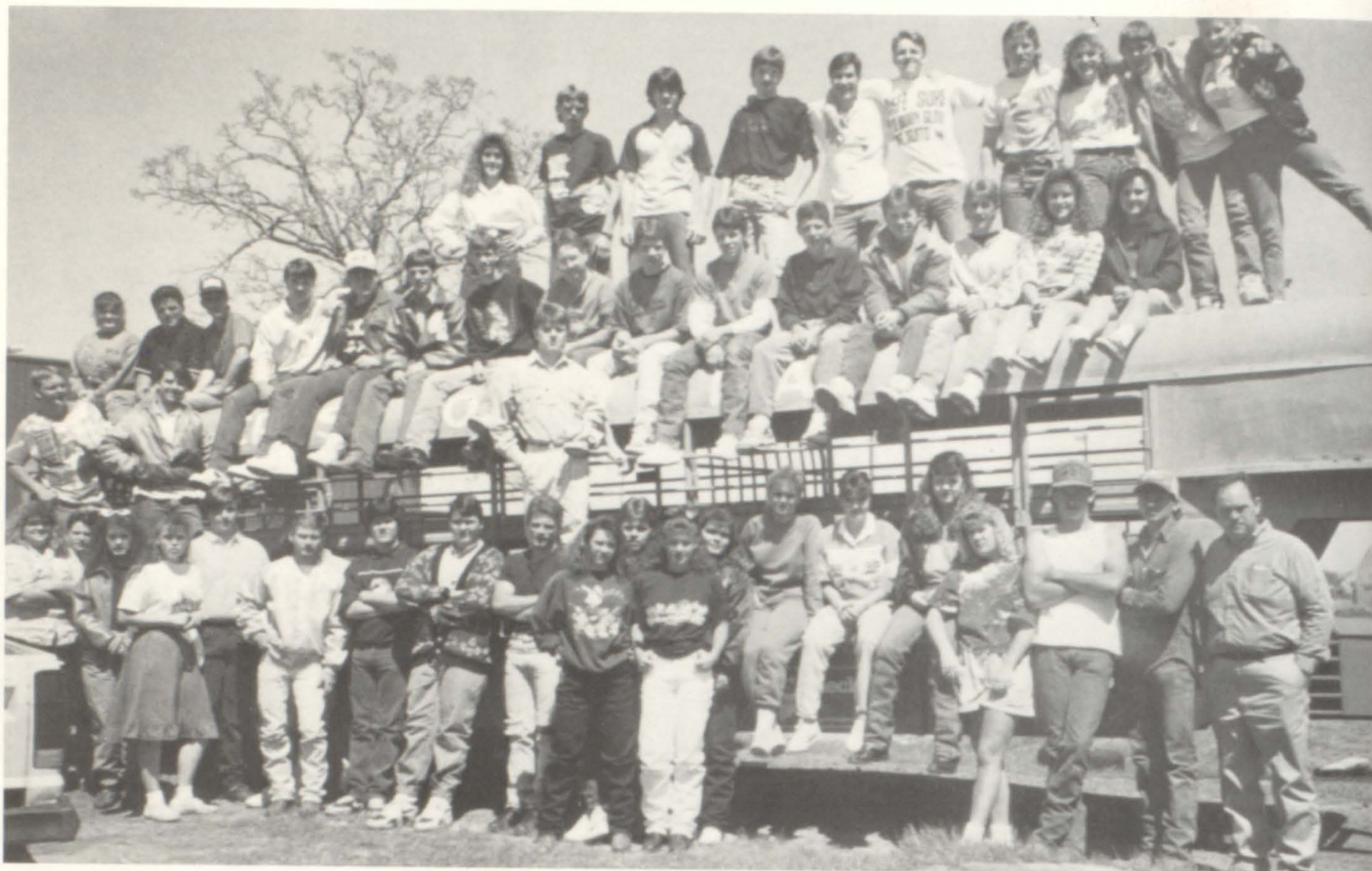

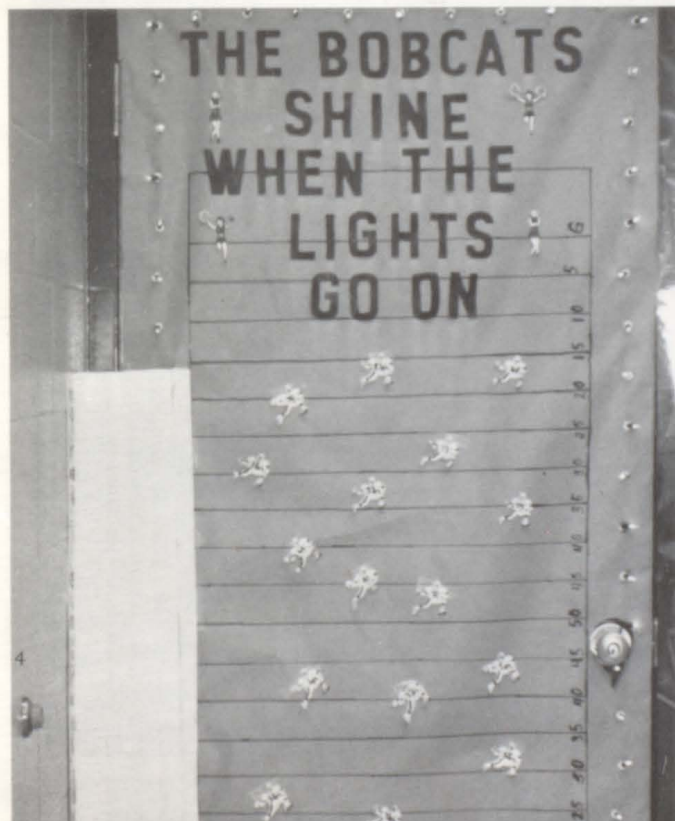

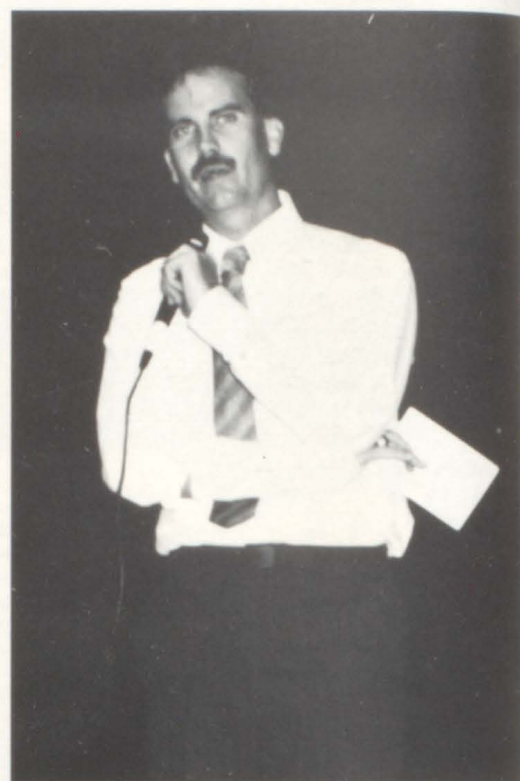

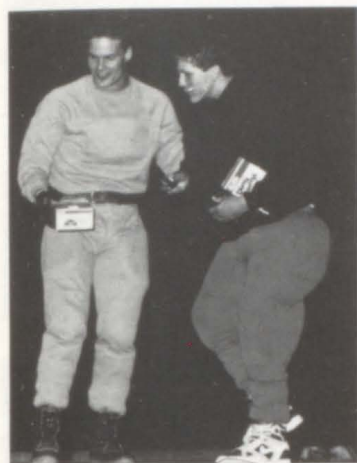
