

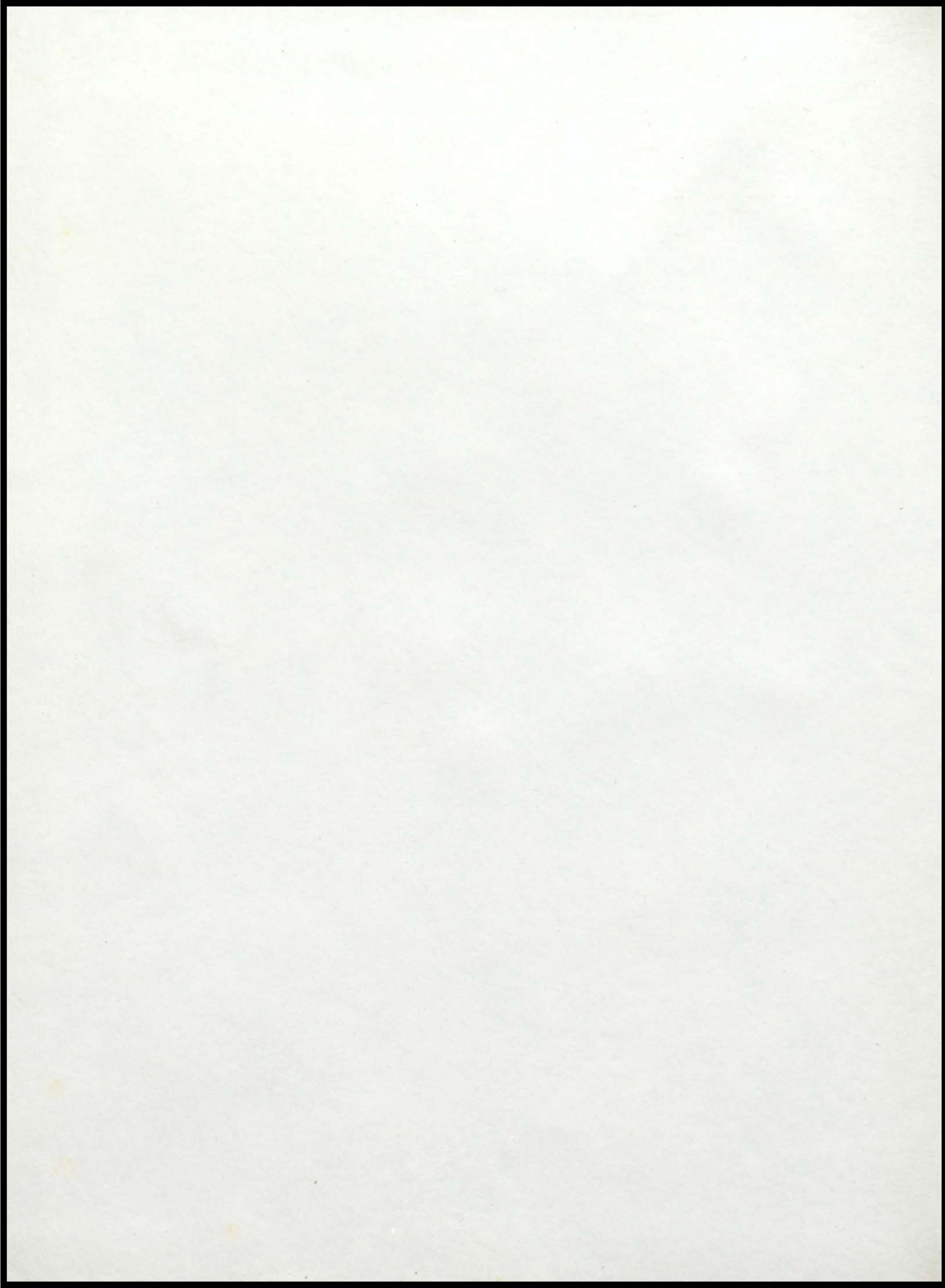

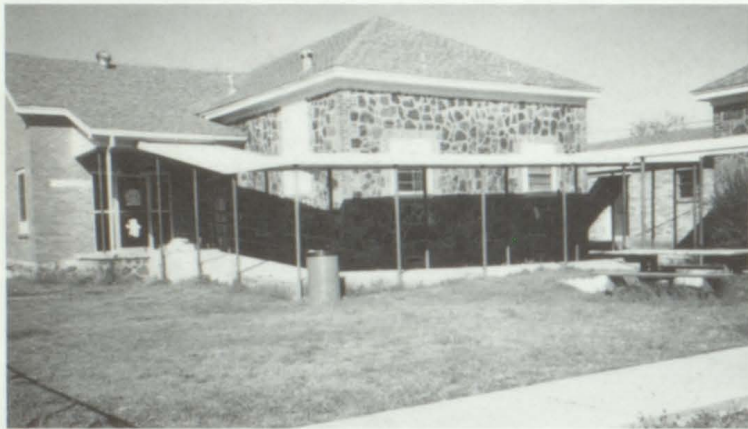

In 1908, a two-room wooden school was built about 12 miles south of Athens. Students attended from both the Old Center and the Old Union schools. In the early 20's, a group of small school districts, including Thompson's Mill, voted to consolidate and Cross Roads School District was born. The first school, a four-room brick building, was built in 1925, and the Teacherage was also built at this time. In those days, the teachers lived in one half of the house, and the superintendents lived in the other half. In 1929, the faculty and staff proudly posed in front of their modern brick facility and their new, streamlined wooden school buses. In the 1930's, the Works Progress Administration built the rock water tower, stadium, and several buildings from stone that was locally quarried. Although much of the masonry work has been demolished to make way for new construction, some has been preserved for historical purposes. The stone water tower, for example, still stands, and is one of only two such towers still standing in East Texas.

Yearbook/Journalism

Six sophomores took on an impossible task on January 1st. They were asked to produce 152 pages of yearbook with half the staff and half the time a normal yearbook would take. They had no camera, no computer, and no experience, but they had all the heart and commitment they needed. 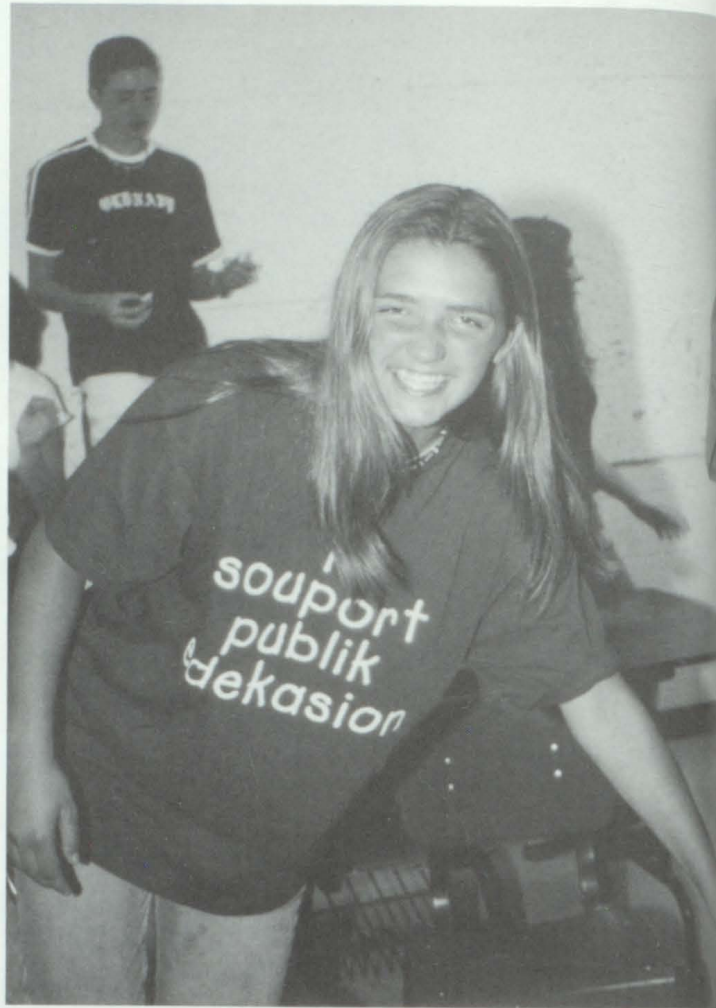

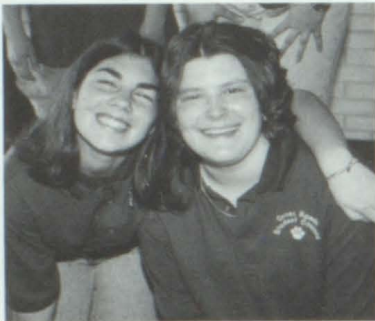

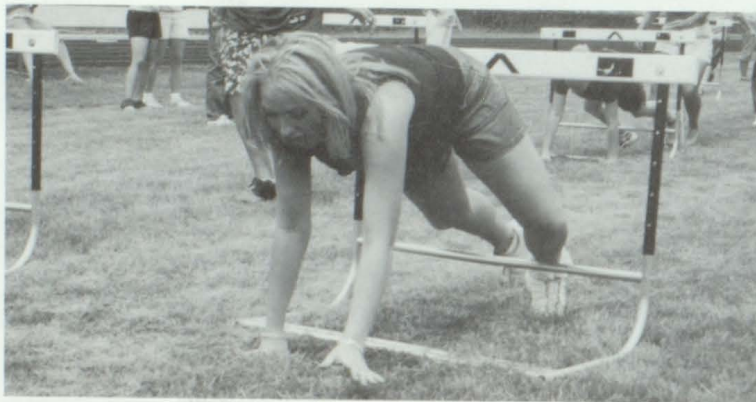

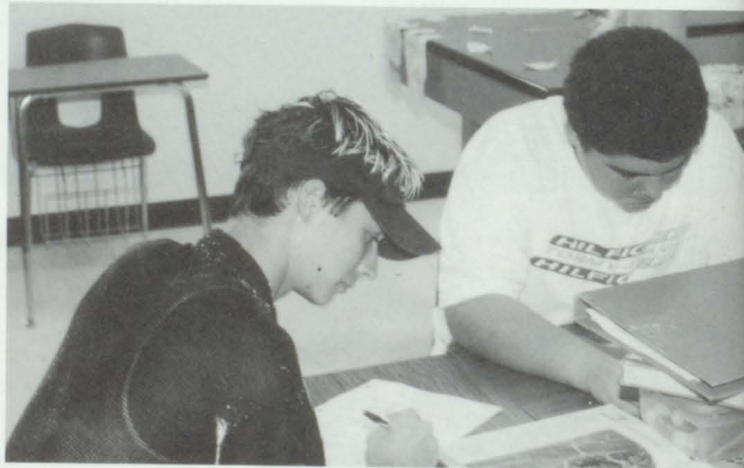

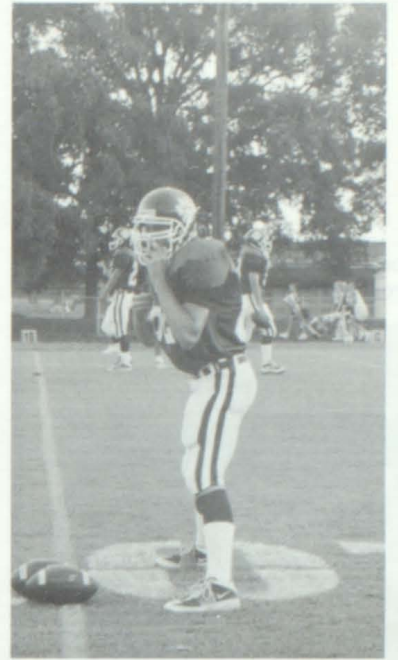

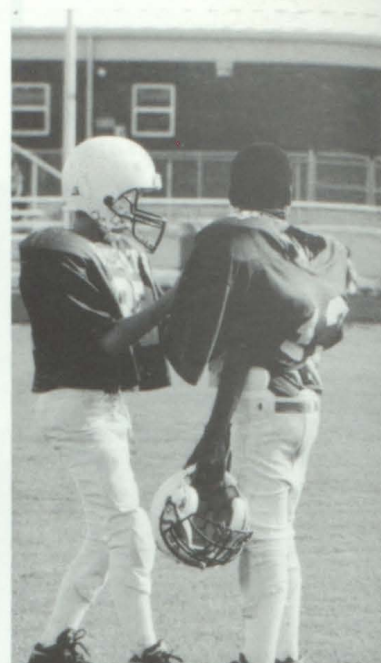
