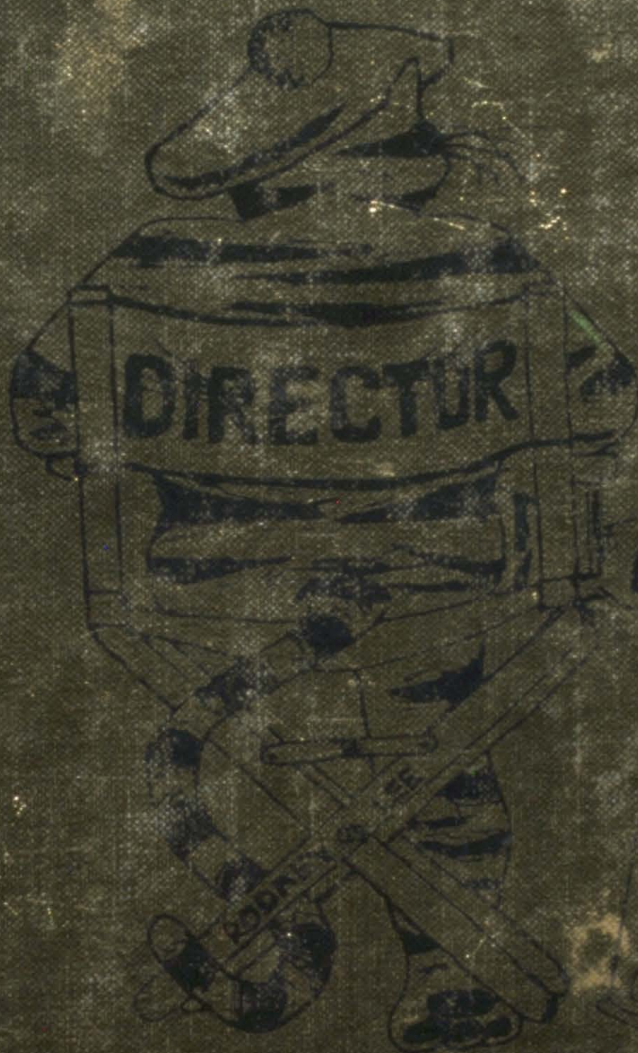
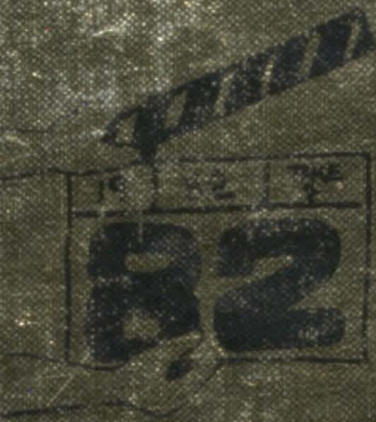

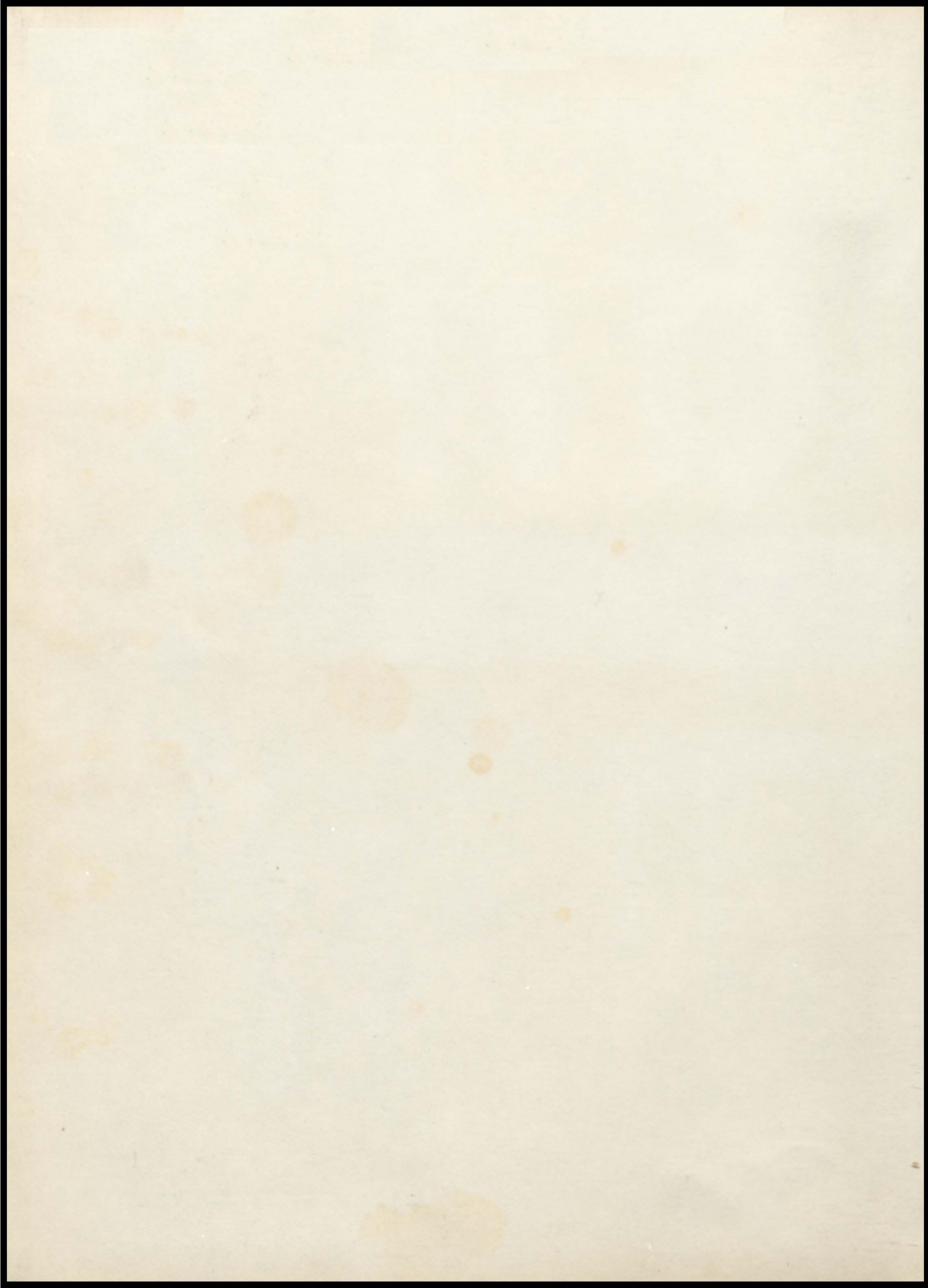

The yearbook staff has tried to capture 1982 as a movie called "Tiger '82". We hope that in these pages you can see and relive 1982 as we saw it.



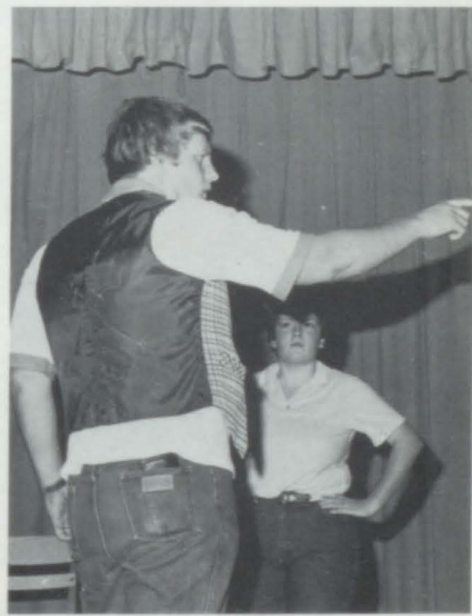

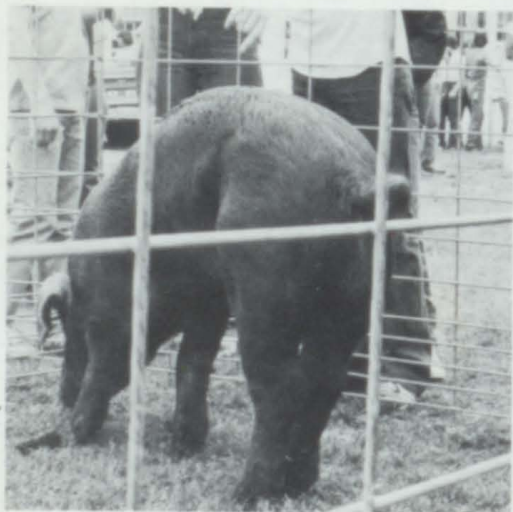

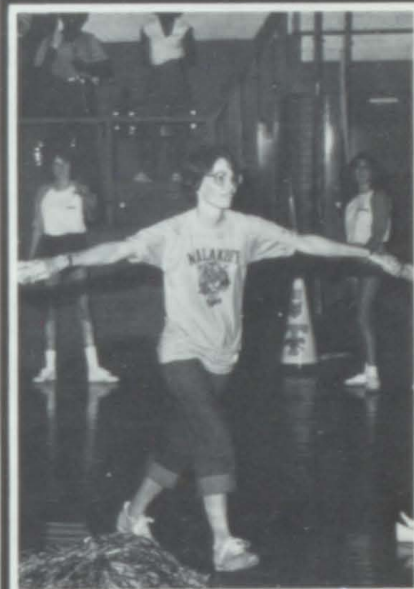

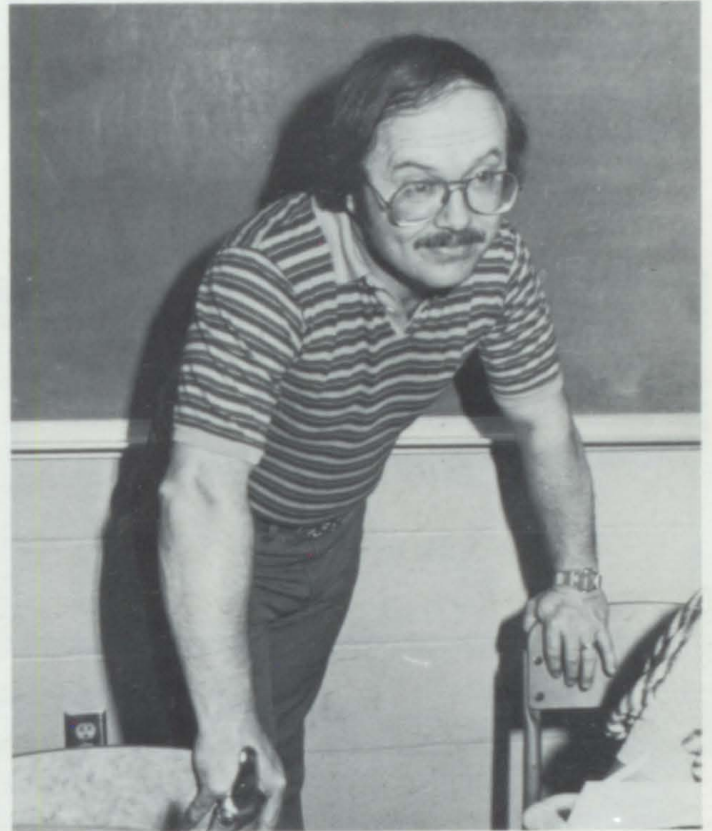

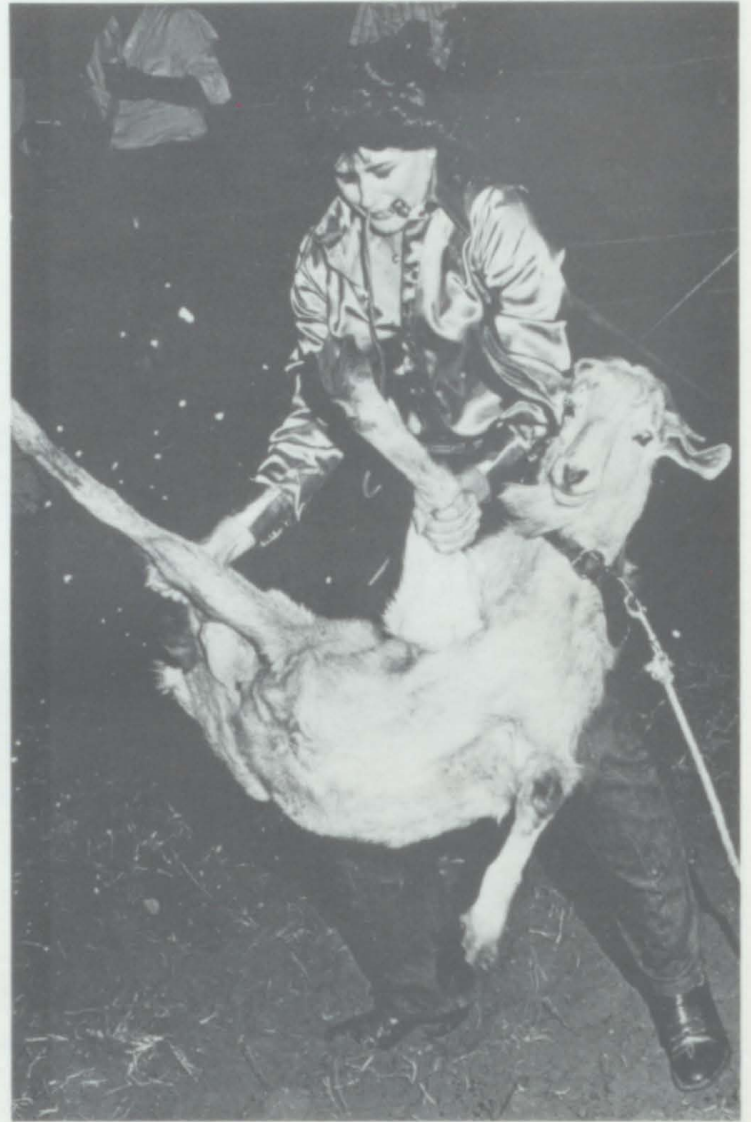

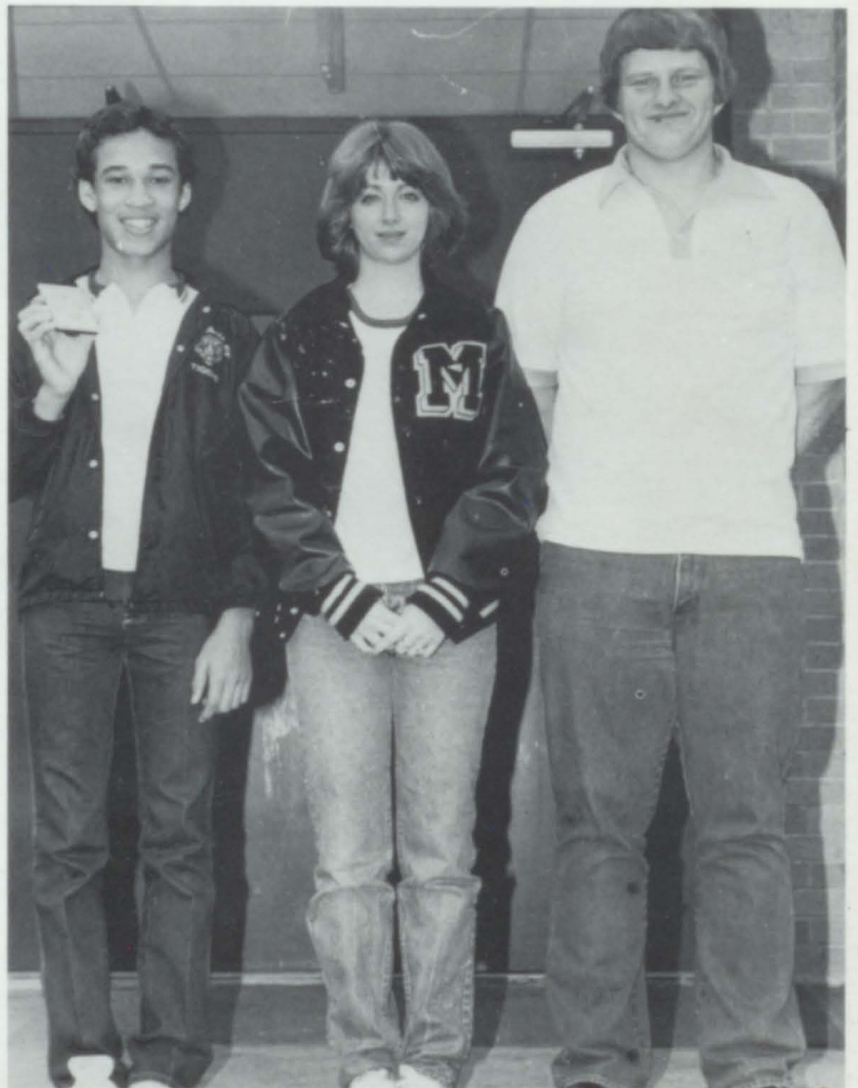

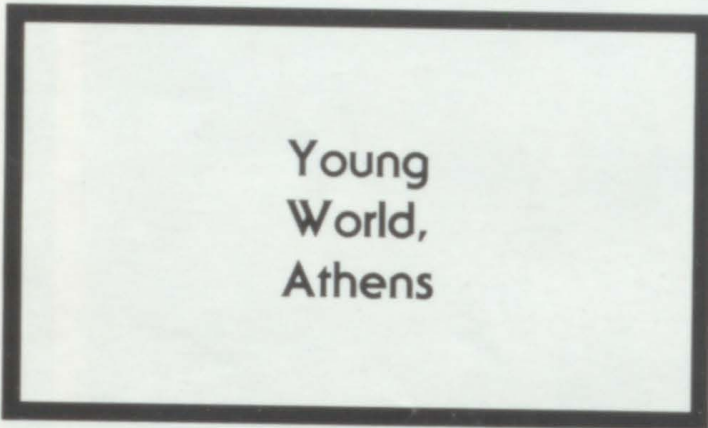

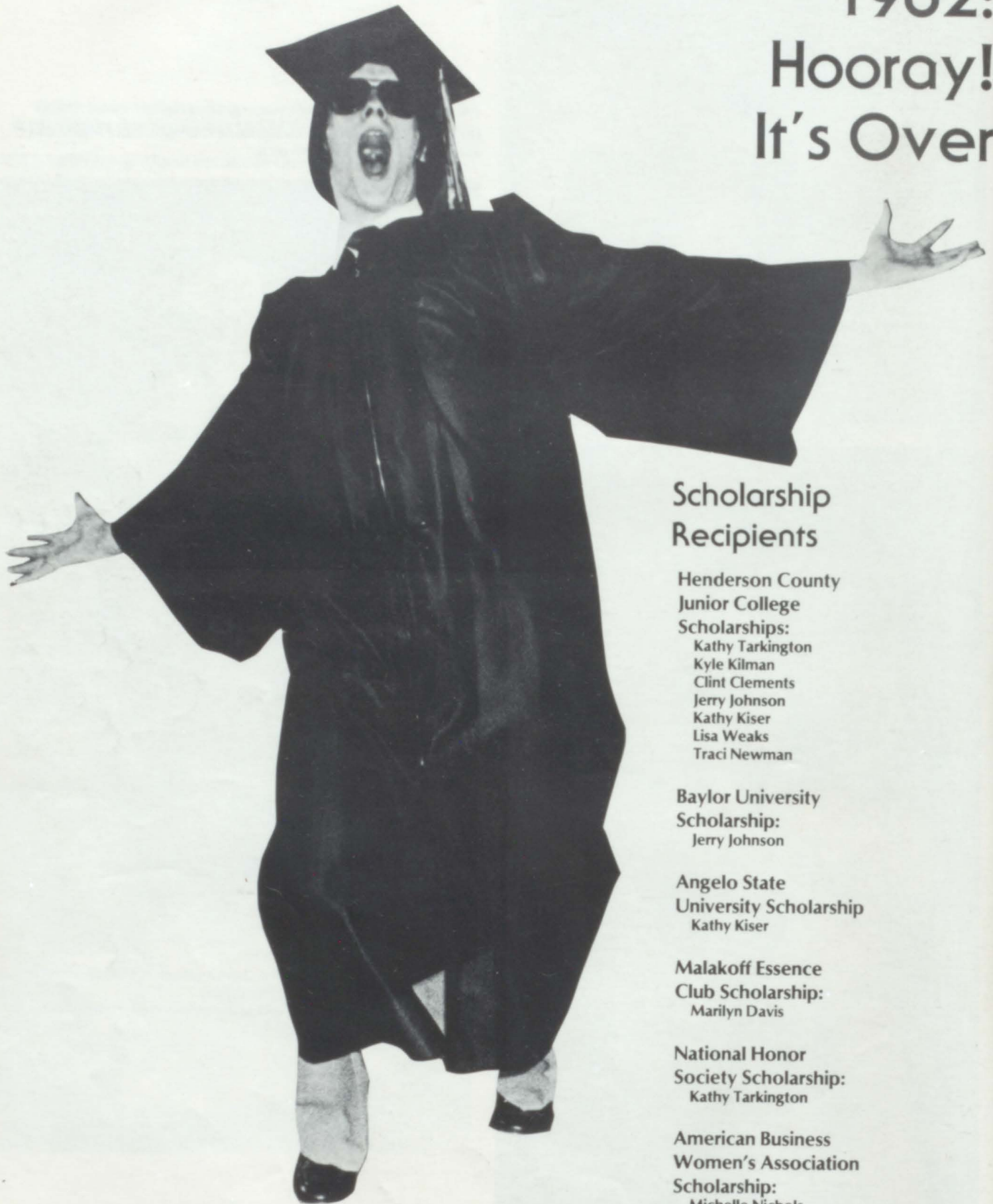

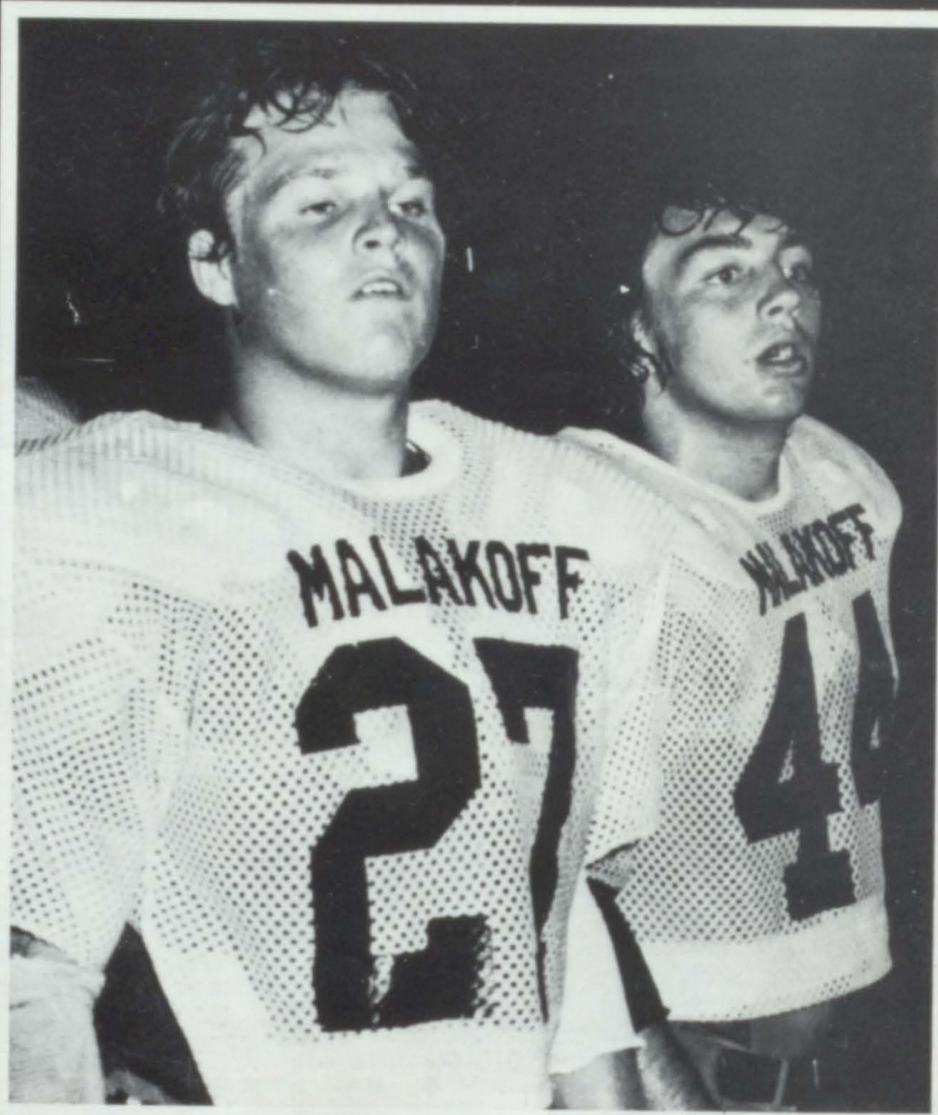


## Tigers Dazzle With 7-3 Slate

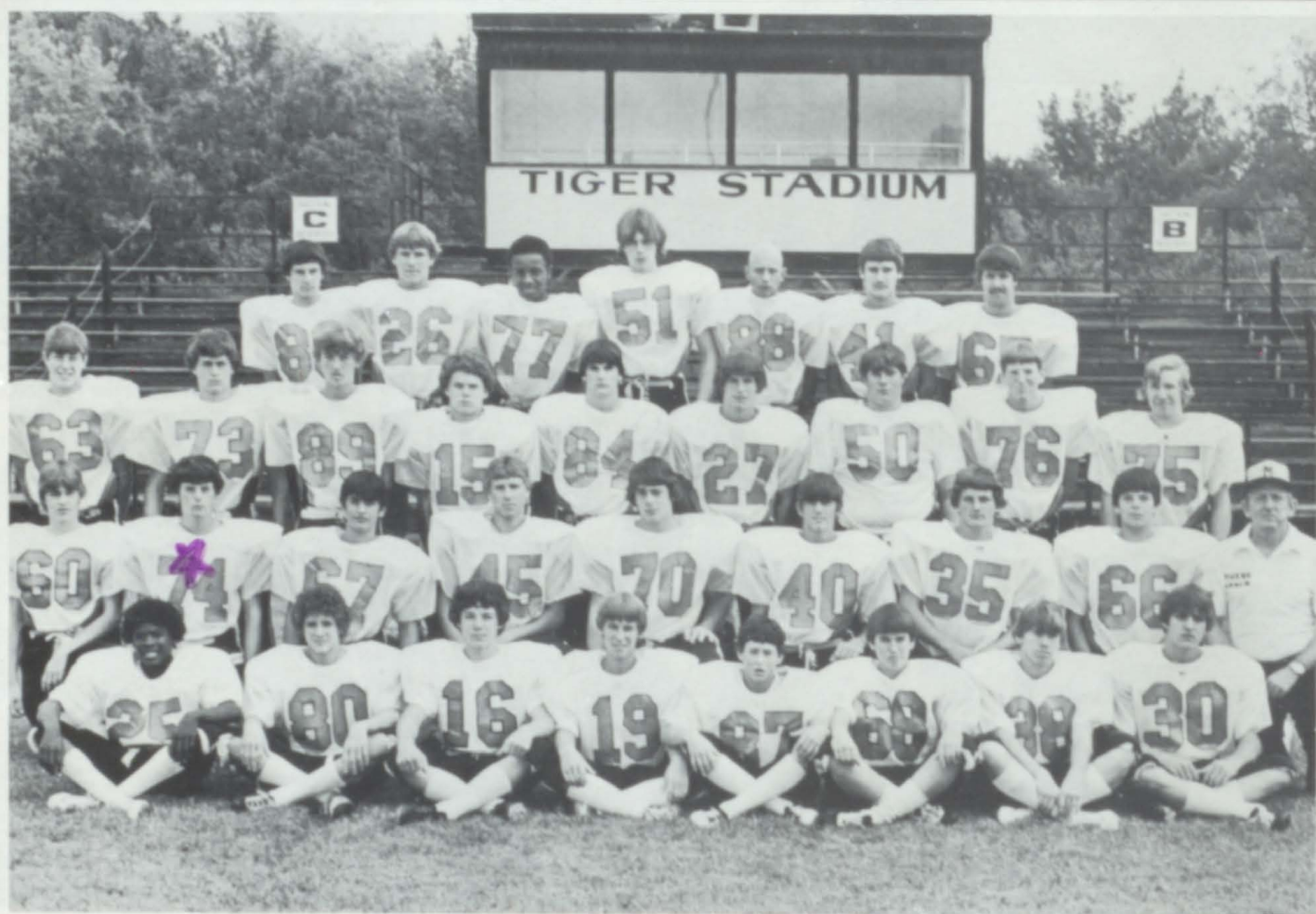

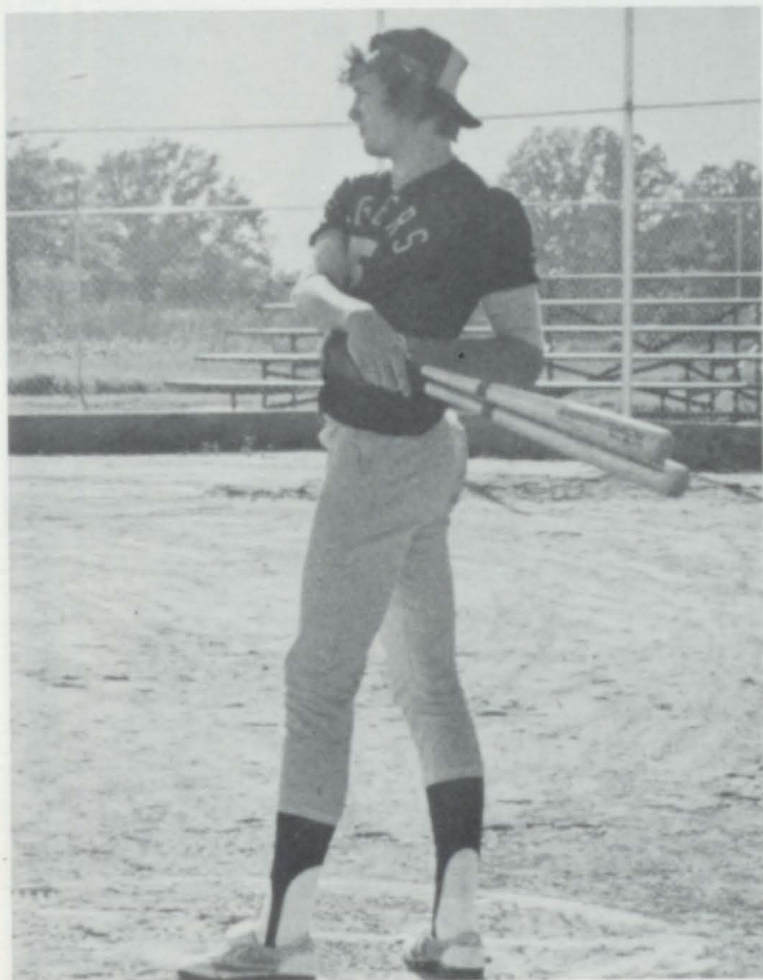

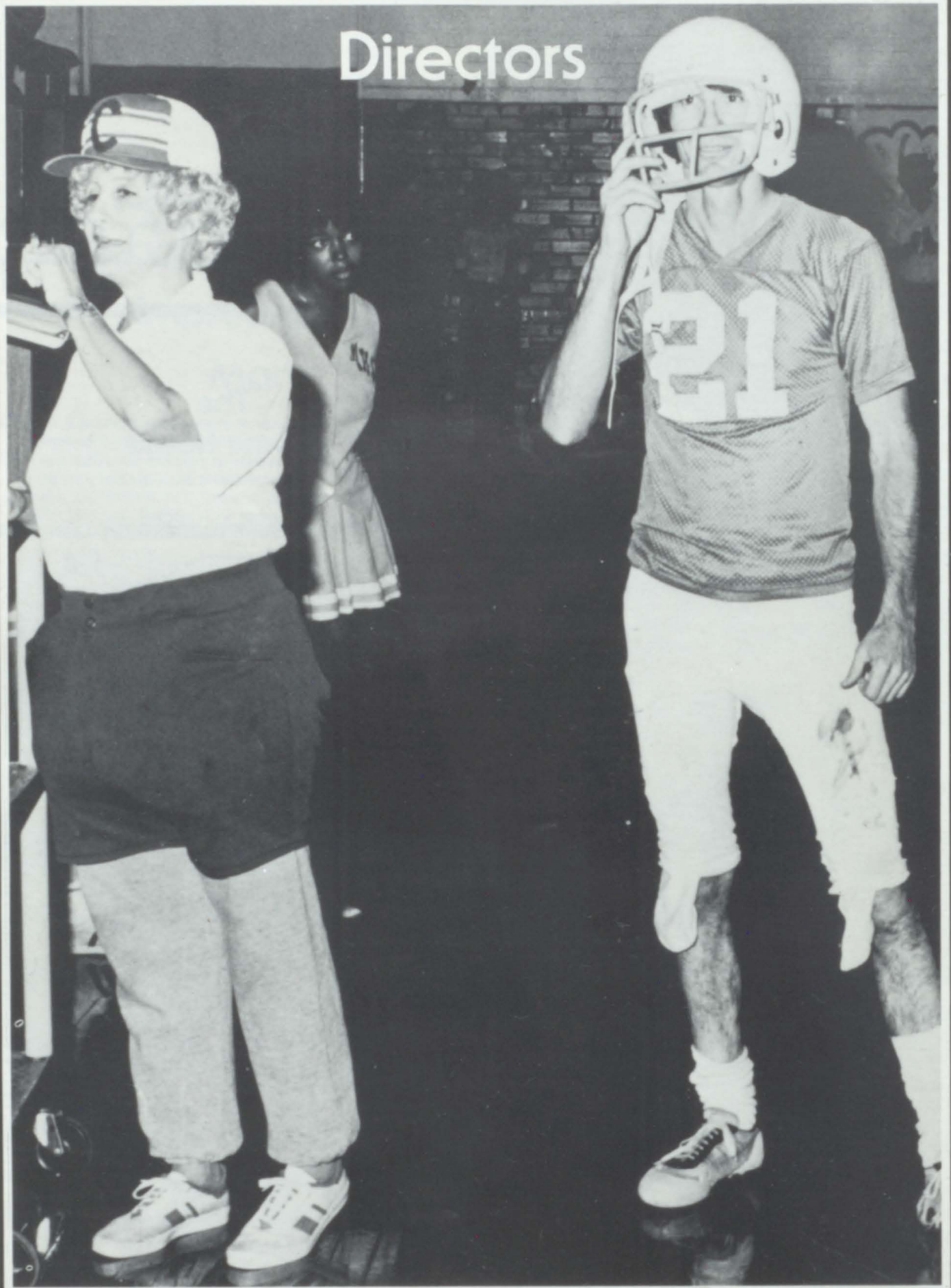

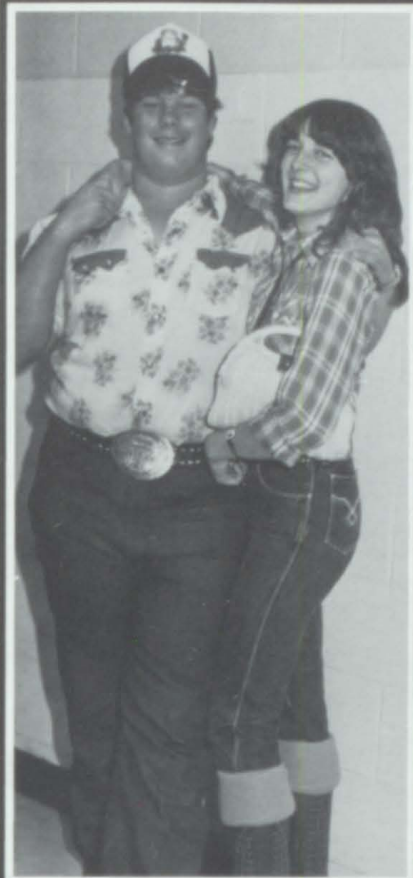
