































EDITORS' PAGE

We hope that you had as much fun making the memories as we did catching them being made. So we present you the "1974 TROJAN."















The 1973 Trojan Football Team opened their season with an awesome victory over Venus. The Trojans anxiously took their home field and humiliated the Bulldogs by defeating them 50 to 8. Mike Hart and Billy Hornbuckle led the scoring with 2 TD's apiece, while Bill Tart and Leslie Brown nabbed 1 each.

On their first road trip of the season the Trojans won a convincing 46 to 0 victory over the Oglesby Bulldogs. The scoring for the Trojans was led by Billy Hornbuckle and Dirk Steele with 2 TD's apiece, and Mike Hart and Hugh Thornburgh sacked 1 each. The Trojan defense played good and Roderick Parker had an outstanding night.

During their third game of the year the Trojans suffered their first loss to the Salado Eagles. Overconfidence and a strong Salado Ball Club humbled the Trojans before a large Homecoming crowd to a 29 to 44 loss. Dirk Steele led the scoring with 2 TD's and Mike Hart and Hugh Thornburg added 1 TD each.

The Trojans got back into the winning column by defeating Milano 29 to 0. Still suffering from the Salado loss, the Trojans played a weak game; however, Lawrence Hornbuckle had a good defensive night. Billy Hornbuckle ran for 2 TD's while Dirk Steele and Hugh Thornburg slipped by for 1 TD each.

The district season opened for the Trojans with a win over the Milford Bulldogs. The game was played in ankle deep mud, but the Trojans came out on top 18 to 13. Dirk Steele and Billy Hornbuckle ran for the first two TD's, and Bill Tart and Steele connected for the game winning score and long pass.

The Trojans were victorious in their second district bout, and came home with a 55 to 26 victory over the Covington Owls. Mike Hart led the Trojans in scoring with 3 TD's, Billy Hornbuckle chalked up 2, and Dirk Steele, Mark Moore, George Hightower, and Lawrence Hornbuckle had 1 TD apiece.

The Trojans tucked another victory under their belts as they crushed the Venus Bulldogs 62 to 12. It was an easy win for the Trojans and it gave them an untarnished 3 and 0 standing in district. The leading scorer of the night was Bill Tart with 3 TD's. Mike Hart donated 2 TD's, while Dirk Steele, Hugh Thornburg, Billy Hornbuckle, and Jimmy Lee gave 1 TD each. The Trojan defense, led by Roderick Parker, had an exceptional night.

With high hopes of the zone championship, the Trojans collided with the Acquilla Cougars; the Cougars fell to the mighty Trojans and gave the Trojans good momentum going into the zone play-off game against Abbott. High scorers for the Trojans were Mike Hart and Billy Hornbuckle with two TD's each; Mark Moore, Leslie Brown, and Edward Polk ran for 1 TD apiece.

The Trojans' last regular season game was scheduled with the Abbott Panthers, who the Trojans had been preparing for since the first day of practice. Abbott, the previously number 1 ranked team in the state, was severely trounced by the Trojans by a score of 56 to 27. The game was a brilliant display of excellent defense and strong, well-knit offense. Dirk Steele led the scoring with 3 TD's, and Hugh Thornburg had 2 TD's, while Billy Hornbuckle, Bill Tart, and Mark Moore ran for 1 each.

After winning their zone, the Trojans took the first step in play-off action by defeating the Tolar Rattlers for the District crown. The game was close all the way to the final gun; however, the Trojans won by a slim margin with a 36 to 30 victory. The Trojan defense played a fine game and made a spectacular goal-line stand in the final seconds of the game. Billy Hornbuckle led Trojan scoring with 3 TD's, while Mike Hart and Dirk Steele gave 1 TD each.

The eager Trojans went into the Regional game with their hearts set on the state champion-ship, and with little difficulty the Trojans ran the Buckholts Badgers off the field with a sound 54 to 6 victory. The Trojan offense had an excellent night, while the defense had very little problem in stopping the Badger's offense. George Hightower and Mark Moore were the leading scorers with 3 TD's each; however, Bill Tart and Mike Hart each ran for 1 TD.


The Trojans' dream of a state championship was shattered by the mighty Cherokee Indians; however the Trojans did make it to the Semi-finals where they were defeated by Cherokee. Although the Trojans played a good game they could not keep up with the future state champions. The Trojan defense did a good job by holding the Indians to 247 yards when they had previously been held to only 400 yards a game. The Trojan offense fought hard; however, the offense was no match for the powerful Cherokee defense as the Trojans suffered a 34 to 8 loss. Bill Tart was the Trojans' sole scorer in the game with 1 TD; however, Billy Hornbuckle did an excellent job of blocking the whole night.














