The 27th was a chance for the SCV & UDC to bring the lives of our beloved confederate veterans "alive" to folks on a "walking tour fundraiser" benefiting The Sherman Museum. This took place at West Hill Cemetery in Sherman, Texas. The tours were told how the Confederate and Union sections of the cemetery came into existence through the hard work of CV's & widows. And now how it is maintained by the SCV & UDC in the area. Wonderful stories of 4 CV's told by SCV member and the life of May Wilson told by UDC / Dixie # 35 member Sherry Cavanaugh, brought to life the lives of those southerners. 








History Comes Alive at West Hill Cemetery A Walking Tour Fundraiser for The Sherman Museum

The house was built by Dr. Randolph Bullock in 1850. Dr. Bullock was also a confederate veteran. The house was the first one in Grayson County to have glass windows. It's first location was 215 West Houston St. in Denison. After the war, Col. Thomas Coke Bass purchased the house. Thomas Bass married Dalton Hocker 10 July 1867. Their daughter Nattie Bass was born 1868 in the house. Nattie died in the house 97 years later. In 1967 plans were started to restore & move the house to the present location which evolved into Frontier Village.

Thomas C. Bass was a lawyer from Mississippi before the war and continued so afterwards in Grayson County. Mr. Bass came to the Grayson County area in 1858. Mr. Bass owned and operated the Sherman Courier a short time in 1866. Mr. Bass developed a system to verify land claims and published it as

"Best System of Abstract." Mr. Bass and Dr. T.J. Heady responded to an appeal for aid to a yellow fever epidemic in Memphis, Tennessee. Both died of the disease. Mr. Bass died on 22 Sept 1878.

Mr. Bass with the wealth of a lawyer, formed the 20th TX Cavalry. He was their Commander as Colonel throughout the war. The 20^{th's} campaigns were mostly in Louisiana & Indian Territory. Union reports of "Texans" among Confederates at the Battle of Prairie Grove, AK 7 Dec 1862, believed to be the 20th TX cavalry. Col. Bass was commander of forces that captured Ft. Washita, OK. On 10 Feb 1864 while at Boggy Depot, Col. Bass requested a medical discharge. That was not granted before his involvement in the Battle of Middle Boggy on 14 Feb 1864.
