THE STATE OF TEXAS

I, Mrs. N. A. Carlton, do hereby make application to the Commissioner of Pensions for a pension, to be granted me under the Act passed by the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Texas, and approved March 26, A. D. 1909, on the following grounds:

I am the widow of C. C. Carlton, deceased, who departed this life on the 25th day of Aug, A. D. 1883, in the county of Angelina, in the State of Texas

I have not remarried since the death of my said husband, and I do solemnly swear that I was never divorced from my said husband, and that I never voluntarily abandoned him during his life, but remained his true, faithful and lawful wife up to the date of his death. I was married to him on the 7th day of April, A. D. 1852, in the county of Taladga, in the State of Ala.

My husband, the said C. C. Carlton, enlisted and served in the military service of the Confederate States during the war between the States of the United States, and that he did not desert the Confederate Service. I have been a resident of the State of Texas since prior to March 1, A. D. 1880, and have been continuously since a citizen of the State of Texas. I do further state that I do not receive from any source whatever money or other means of support amounting in value to the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars per annum, nor do I own in my own right, nor does anyone hold in trust for my benefit or use, estate or property, either real, personal or mixed, either in fee or for life, of the value of one thousand dollars; nor do I receive any aid or pension from any other State, or from the United States, or from any other source, and I do further state that the answers given to the following questions are true:

1. What is your age? 77 yrs.
2. Where were you born? Blount Co. Ala.
3. How long have you resided in the State of Texas? Since 1868
4. How long have you resided in the county of your present residence? And what is your postoffice address? Since Nov. 1872 Longview, Tx. R.F.D. # 2
5. What was your husband's full name? Columbus Columbus Carlton
6. What was the date of his death? Aug. 25 = 1883
7. In what State was your husband's command originally organized? La.
8. How long did your husband serve? If known to you, give date of enlistment and discharge Enlisted May 9th 1862 & served until close of war 1865-

9. What was the name or letter of the company, or name or number of the battalion, regiment or battery of artillery in which your husband served? If he was transferred from one branch of service to another, give time of transfer, description of command and time of service Co. "E" 28th La. Regt.



10. Name branch of service in which your husband served, whether infantry, cavalry, artillery or the navy, or if commissioned as an officer by the President, his rank and line of duty, or if detailed for special service, under the law of conscription, the nature of such service, and time of service.

11. Have you transferred to others any property of any kind for the purpose of becoming a beneficiary under this law? No

Wherefore your petitioner prays that her application for a pension be approved and such other proceedings be had in the premises as are required by law.

- INT. 2. Do you personally know, or did you at any time know C. C. Carlton J. N. A. Carlton who is is an applicant for pension under Act of March 26, 1909?
- INT. 3. How long had you known the said C. C. Carlton and when and where did you first know him?
- INT. 4. Do you personally know that the said C. C. Carlton enlisted in the service of the Confederacy, and performed the duties of a soldier or a sailor?
- INT. 5. Do you personally know in what company and regiment the said C. C. Carlton enlisted and served in the Confederate army? When? Where? And the time of service? If you personally knew and so have stated that he enlisted and served in the Confederate navy, then state: When? Where? And how long he so served?
- INT. 6. Do you personally know that said C. C. Carlton was commissioned as an officer directly by the President of the Confederate States? What was his rank and line of duty?
- INT. 7. Do you further know if C. C. Carlton was, under the provisions of the conscript law, detailed for any kind of special service in the field, shops, armories, etc., of the Confederacy? What was the nature of his service, and how long did he serve?

To the 5th Int. she answers,

I think it was Co. E 28th La. Regiment He joined in 1862 and served till the close of the war.

To the 6th Int she answers,

He was a private soldier

To the 7th Int. she answers;

I do not know



Answers to cross Int.

To the 1st cross Int. she answers,

I know that he served in the Confederate Army because I saw him leave home to go to the Army and I stayed with his family while he was gone and I know he came home on furloughs and at the close of the war

I never knew any other person by the name of C.C. Corlton

To the 2nd Int she answers:

Yes I am certain that he is the one that served in the war.

To the 3rd Int she answers:

Yes so far as I know I never heard any complaint.

To the 4th Cross Int she answers:

He never deserted or voluntarily abandoned his post of duty while in the service.

Answers of W.D. Bynum

To the 1st Int W.D. Bynum answers

My name is W.D. Bynum I am 58 years of age I reside in Angelina County, Texas. My Post office is Lupton

To the 2nd Int. he answers:

Yes I personally knew C.C. Corlton deceased husband of N.A. Corlton.

To the 3rd Int. he answers:

I knew him all my life I first knew him in Louisiana about the beginning of the war when I was a small child

To the 4th Int. he answers

He went to the war and I saw him when he came home on furlow and I saw him when he came home at the close of the war I remember that he showed me his bayonet and arms used in the war.

To the 5th Int. he answers.

The war must have been on for about one year before he left home to join the army. He joined in Louisiana I have been told that it was Co. E 28th La. Regiment. I was too young to remember details

To the 6th Int. he answers;

I do not know

To the 7th Int. he answers

I do not know.

Answers to Cross Int.

To the 1st Cross Int. he answers;

I saw him when he went off to the war I saw him when he came home. I saw him when he was brought home sick and I heard him talk of the war and talk of his service in the Army. I never knew of any other C. C. Carlton except his son born after the war

To the 2nd Cross Int. he answers.

I am certain that the said C. C. Carlton is the identical person who served in the Confederate war as testified by me

To the 3rd Cross Int. he answers

C. C. Carlton was said to have made a good soldier. I never heard of any dishonorable conduct on his part

To the 4th Cross Int. he answers

He never deserted nor abandoned his post of duty as a soldier that I ever heard of

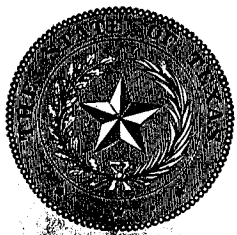
