To the Honorable County Judge of T. Ugg County, Texas.

Your petitioner, Mrs. Ann Dudley respectfully represents that she is a resident citizen of T. Ugg County, in the State of Texas; that she is the widow of W. C. Dudley, deceased, who was a Confederate soldier (or sailor), and that she makes this application for the purpose of obtaining a pension as the widow of said

W. C. Dudley deceased, under the act passed by the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Texas, and approved May 12, A. D. 1899, the same being an act entitled "An act to carry into effect the amendment to the Constitution of the State of Texas, providing that aid may be granted to disabled and dependent Confederate soldiers, sailors, and their widows under certain conditions, and to make an appropriation therefor," and I do solemnly swear that the answers I have given to the following questions are true.

NOTE—Applicant must make answer to all of the following questions, and such answers must be written out plainly in ink.

- Q. What is your name? Answer Mrs. Ann Dudley
- Q. What is your age? Answer Sixty three (63) years
- Q. In what County do you reside? Answer T. Ugg
- Q. How long have you resided in said County and what is your post-office address? Answer Have resided in T. Ugg County 20 years: Kilgore, Tex.
- Q. Have you applied for a pension under the Confederate Pension Law heretofore, and been rejected? If so, state when and where. Answer No.
- Q. What is your occupation, if able to engage in one? Answer No occupation
- Q. What is your physical condition? Answer Have not been in good health
- Q. What was the name of your deceased husband? Answer W. C. Dudley
- Q. Were you married to him anterior to March 1, 1866? If so, on what date were you married to him and where? Answer We were married in Oct. 1859 in Rush County, Tex.
- Q. What was the date of his death? Answer Jan. 9th, 1905
- Q. Are you unmarried, and have you so remained unmarried since the death of your said husband for whose services you claim a pension? Answer Yes
- Q. In what State was your husband's command originally organized? Answer Texas
- Q. How long did your husband serve? Give date of enlistment and discharge. Answer 3 years and 6 months, enlisted in Aug. 1862, discharged 1865
- Q. What was the name or letter of your husband's company and name or number of his regiment?  
Answer Company "D" 6th Cavalry Regiment
- Q. State whether he served in the infantry, artillery, cavalry, or the navy. Answer Cavalry
- Q. State whether or not you have received any pension or veteran donation land certificate under any previous law, and if you answer in the affirmative state what pension or veteran donation land certificate you have received. Answer No.

You were married in Oct. 1859 in Rush County, Tex.
