I, Mrs. R. S. Flatt do hereby make application to the Comptroller of Public Accounts for a pension, to be granted me under the Act passed by the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Texas, and approved April 7, A. D. 1913, ^{and subsequent acts of Legislature} on the following grounds:

I am the widow of R. S. Flatt deceased, who departed this life on the 19th day of Oct, A. D. 1926 in the county of Gregg in the State of Texas

I have not remarried since the death of my said husband, and I do solemnly swear that I was never divorced from my said husband, and that I never voluntarily abandoned him during his life, but remained his true, faithful and lawful wife up to the date of his death. I was married to him on the 7th day of July A. D. 1900 in the county of Parker in the State of Texas

My husband, the said R. S. Flatt, enlisted and served in the military service of the Confederate States during the war between the States of the United States, and that he did not desert the Confederate service. I have been a resident of the State of Texas since prior to January 1, A. D. 1900, and have been continuously since a citizen of the State of Texas. I do further state that I do not receive from any source whatever money or other means of support amounting in value to the sum of \$300.00 per annum, nor do I own in my own right, nor does anyone hold in trust for my benefit or use, estate or property, either real, personal or mixed, either in fee or for life, of the value of one thousand dollars, exclusive of the home of the value of not over \$1000; nor do I receive any aid or pension from any other State, or from the United States, or from any other source, and I do further state that the answers given to the following questions are true:

To the third interrogatory the said W. P. McLean- Witness answers, About 59 years. Early in the Spring of 1862 in the Confederate Army. He and I were members of the 19th Texas Infantry, Confederate Army. The regiment at that time being in the State of Arkansas.

To the fourth interrogatory the said W. P. McLean, Witness answers I do. He performed the services of a soldier in said regiment.

To the fifth interrogatory the said W. P. McLean- Witness answers: He served in Company G, 19 Texas Infantry. He served in said Company Regiment and Army in the Trans-Mississippi Department from early in 1862 until the close of the war.

To the sixth interrogatory the said W. P. McLean - Witness answers: He was not commissioned as such.

To the seventh interrogatory the said W. P. McLean - Witness answers: He only served as a soldier in the ranks and was not conscripted. I have already answered this question. He was a private.



CROSS-INTERROGATORIES

To the first interrogatory the said W. P. McLean - Witness answers:

I personally know that R. S. Flatt who is making this application for pension served as a soldier in the Company and Regiment above mentioned. I was Adjutant of said Regiment and was with the Regiment and Brigade to which it belonged from early in 1862 until the close of the war. R. S. Flatt was known as Sam Flatt in his company and has been called by that name at all times since then and I know of no other person who bears that name and know that he is the identical person who is now applying for the pension.

You are advised that your application for a Confederate pension will be approved when the amended pension law becomes effective, June 18, 1925. Same cannot be approved earlier on account of your statement that you were married to Mr. R. S. Flatt, Feb. 7, 1900.

The present pension laws require that widow applicants must have been married to veteran, on whose service record pension is applied for, prior to Jan. 1, 1900. The amended law requires that widow applicants must have been married to veteran prior to Jan. 1, 1910.

Will you please file with your application statement showing date of your birth, and date of your arrival in the State of Texas.

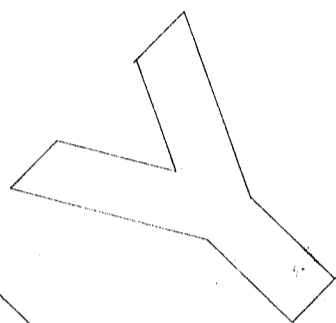

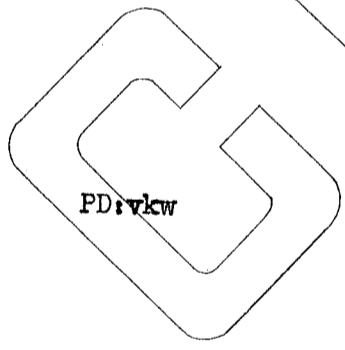

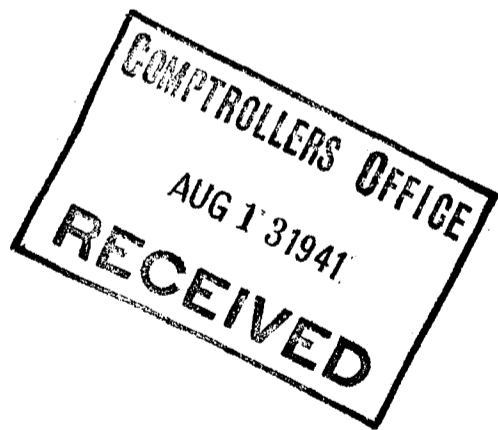
