JOHN SMITH was born in South Carolina in 1810, married Agnes Cooper (born about 1809). They moved to Georgia some time afte 1837.

John fought in the Florida Indian War, which began in 1835 with the Seminoles. It is not known how long John Smith served, although the war itself lasted for seven years.

They moved to Texas in 1856, settling in Houston County near the present community of Hopewell. John ran a grist-mill, was a amker of Ox-bows, and a blacksmith. Such a necessary occupation provided the opportunity to invite travellers to stay overnight in the Smith home, to rest their horses, or to have repairs made. Agness especially enjoyed these occasions, with visitors bringing stories and news from "bome."

JOHN TEXAS SMITH was born March 17, 1845 in Cherokee County, Georgia to John and Agnes Cooper Smith. They came to Houston County in 1856, settling east of Crockett, near what is now the Hopewell community.

He was married to Margaret Craddock (born about 1840) and they had these children: Walter, born 1886; Charlie, born March 11, 1869; Fanny Daisy, born Nov.8,1874; Roscoe Blaine, born June 20, 1879, died Jan 19, 1892; and probably another child who died in infancy. Daisy married Ed Wells, but died about one year later, on July 13, 1894.

Walter married Mary Berry. Their children are Myrtle, born 1891 and Oveta, born 1898.

Charlie married Tommie Lula Berry (sister of Mary Berry-sisters married brothers). They had one child, Una Smith. Second wife, Maynie Lunt, one daughter, Lillie Mae, married Jay Nelson Journeay (1900-1939). Lillie Mae now resides in Dallas. She has one son, Jay Nelson Journeay, Jr.

John Texas Smith enlisted in the Confederate Army in Crockett in 1863, in Co., b, 13th Texas Cavalry, where he attained the rank of Captain.

The "Tex," as he was familiarly known, Smith family moved to Palestine about the time of the building of the IGN Railroad. Charlie and Walter worked in the railroad shops most of their lives. Walter's faimily later moved to San Antonio, where both he and Mary are buried, and Myrtle and Oveta still live.

Charlie's family lived on a farm south of Palestine during the "horse and buggy" days, and most mornings, "Tex" would take his Granddaughter, Lillie Mae, to school in Palestine. After they moved in to town, he busied himself with a garden, while living in the home of Charlie and Maynie. On Dec. 20, 1928 John Texas Smith died after a one-week bout with pneumonia. THE CHRISTIAN CHURCH

Priot to 1899 or 1900, there was no organized Christian Church in About that thime a small band of members of this Crockett. denomination were accustomed to meet first in the Opera House and

later in the District Court room in the courthouse and hold religious services, which were conducted by Rev. Virgil Graves. During the year 1901 Rev. Harry H. Hamilton, of Lovelady, began to visit this little flock and soon gathered quite a number of followers in to a congregation that undertook the erection of a church building. Too much credit cannot be given Mr. and Mrs. W. V. Berry for their share in infusing new life into the church at this time. It is hardly an over statement to say that had it not been for the efficient efforts of Mr. Berry, at that time, it is probable that the present attractive church building would never have been erected. The following ministers have served this church since the erection of the church building:

Rev. J. A. Arnold, Rev. B. F. Trimble, Rev. Edmund S. Allhands, Rev. W. B. Parks, Rev. I. N. Jett, Rev. Albert T. Pitts, Rev. W. H. Marler, REv. John A. Stephens, Rev. J. W. Walton and the present pastor, Rev. Marion Browning.

An August 3 report said "Granny6" Fahl, who died Wednesday at home in Mt. Blanchard, Hancock County, Ohio, and revealed hiding places of her money in an inner wall of her house. over \$1,000 was found in gold, silver and greenbacks. When she and her husband came from Germany, they brought over \$30,000 in gold and silver and were thrifty; so Mr. Hammond, who bought the house, guarded it.

THE GOODWIN STORY

The Goodwins of Houston County came to Texas from Georgia. Henry Goodwin and hi son Sherley Goodwin had Spanish land grants in 1834 and 1835. They lived in Texas under four flags in their lifetime, and many o thier descendants still live in Houston County. Sherley was in Milam Lodge No., 2; Daniel operated a general store in the Holly Community and

farmed his acreage to raise his family of thirteen children. The closest Railroad was in Lovelady, and Daniel went there by wagon to pick up his supplies. Cader met with the first Church of Christ in Lovelady in 1891.

The Goodwin linage is as follows; Henry (1779-184-) married Sarah (1781-1850); both were born in Georgia and died in Angelina County Texas. Their children were Sherley b. 1799, Elizabeth Jane b. 1802, Robert b/ 1810, and George b. 1818. Robert married Sarah- and two sons: James b 1831, and John b 1833. Elizabeth Jane married Moses Gage in 1819 and had nine children: Sherley (1822-1850), Moses (1835-1851), buried at Bastrop, Joseph b. 1825, Gabriella b. 1827, Isaac Crouch b. 1832, Elizabeth Jane b. 1838 married a Patterson and died in 1920, John Austin b. 1840, George Washington b. 1843, and Martha Ellen (1848-1874).

There is no data on George.

Sherley married Elizabeth in Lincoln Country, Georgia. They were both born in 1799 in Goergia. Their children were: William M. b. 1821, Joseph b. 1827, and Jane b 18--. The 1850 Census shows on Andrew McFadden, age 6, living in Sherley's household. He is still living with them in 1860; his relationship has not been established. William M. married first Elizabeth Spears and had twn children: john b 1943, Sarah Jane b. 1845, W. Andrew b. 1847, Elizabeth A. b. 1849, Cader b. 1852, Daniel b. 1854, M. J. b. 1858, Amanda b. 1861, M. C. b 1863, and Benjamin Franklin b. 1866. William's second wife was Sarah Thornton. To them ws born: Julia b. 1869, Tabitha b. 1872, Rachel b. 1874, and Lunna b. 1878. Sarah had a daughter, Jane Thornton b. 1854 in Mississippi, who lived with them.

Cader's wife was Dary-; they had Laura b. 1878 and Buleah b. 1880, and Oscar. John married Amanda from Louisiana and had two children. Sarah Jane married but had no children. W. Andrew's wife was Jane--. They had two boys and three girls. Benjamin married Nettie Eddleman and had two daughters: Willie who married S. F. Moore and Iver who married Willie Rosser and had one daughter and three sons. Willie and S. F. had one son and one daughter.

Daniel (1854-1929) married Mary Temperance Click (1859-1929) of the Clicks of Houston County. Their thirteen children, all born in Houston County were: Bena Ardena (1878-1976) m. Calvin J. Sanders b 1872, and had six children: Londzo married Alma Smith, Charlie m. Susie Smith, Gladys m. Willie Rowe, Henry m. Annie Bell Raines, Gussie m. Warren Raines, Bertharence never married. There were four others who died as infants. Wilard Vernon (1879-1959) married Mae Curtley; they had five children: Milton who married a Keyes and had no children; his second marriage produced one girl and two boys. Elvin Goodwin married and had one girl. Burtis Goodwin m. Alma Le Naron, no issue. Paul Curtis Goodwin married Leatha

Midgett and had one boy. Lucille m. Boyd Smith and had one boy and one girl. Oda Adella b. 1881 died as a child. Myrtle Verilla Goodwin (1882-1961) married first John Thomas Williams (1874-1926) from Falls County. They had Maude b. 1905 m. Manse Wright of Madisonville and had one son Vernon Ray, and two grandsons. Miller Williams (1908-1936) m. Eranes Swinner and had six children; Dorothy Swinner m. Pfieffer had four children. Willis Swinner m. Betty-, no children. Christelle Swinner m. goforth and had six children. Melba Swinner m. Haynes. Johnny Fred married and has several children. Miller Jean married and had several children; she died in Houston in 1977. Myrtle's third child was Christabell Williams (1910-1928) m. Jim Swinner and had no children. Daniel Franklin Williams b. 1918 m. Imogene Langham of San Antonio. They had three sons: Thomas Franklin b. 1941 m. Corienna Morrow of St. Johns New Foundland; they have on edaughter. Dana Ellis b. 1942 m. Connie Lee Price of San Antonion; they have three girls and one boy. Steven Riley b. 1944 m. Ellie Mae Brown of Kerrville. They have two boys and one girl. John Thomas was killed when he jumped from a moving truck to retrieve his hat, blown off by the wind. The accident, in 1926, occurred on the between the town of Trinity and the river. Myrtle's second marriage in 1932 was to Fred Hawthorne Riley of Midway. They had no children.

Lawson Howard (1885-1971) m. Edna Lankford in Asperment, and raised his two children in Abiline, where he is buried. Mary Lou m. Kenneth Ross; they have one girl. L. H. Jr. now divorced has two children.

Horatio Bolden Goodwin (1807-1953) m. Nellie Hammond and had six girls: Susie m. Clint Eaves and had one girl, now deceased. Catherine m. Jimmy Williamson, has one son and two grandchildren. Anna m. Floyd Standley and had twn children. Marie Goodwin m. Ernest Hodges and had two boys, one girl and four grandchildren. Ella Goodwin m. Ted Stramblad; they had three girls and two grandchildren, Maybelle Goodwin m. George High; they two sons and three grandchildren. Imogene Goodwin m. Allen Tackard; they had one boy and two girls. Robert Goodwin (1869-1899) died as a child. Willie Clarence (1892-1908) was unmarried. Cader James Goodwin (1894-1972) m. Modie Wills; they had: Eloise m. Dan Carnley. They had two girls and two boys. Laverne m. Olan Clay; they had three girls and two boys. Sherrell m. Laverne Parker and they had two girls. Jim and Modie also had twins sons who died as babies.

Daniel Franklin Goodwin (1896-1950). Ollie Atkinson of Louisiana and they had two sons. Dan Jr. b. 1930 m. Helen V. Jenkins and had 4 sons; and James Randall b. 1933. Nona Ann Goodwin (1898-1970) m. Earl Baucom; they had no children. Berniece Ovid Goodwin (1901-1904) and Lillian Iveda (1905-1929) were not married.

While there are no Goodwin boys presently living in Houston County, who knows when they might return to the Land of their Forefathers.
