Mr. Julius Walker Clebourn, Sr. was born in Houston (Harris County) Texas on July 20, 1944 to the late St. Julius Clebourn and Cora Bell McClain Clebourn and was their first born son.

Mr. Clebourn was a graduate of Booker T. Washington High School in 1962 and Commonwealth College of Mortuary Services in Houston in 1971.

Mr. Clebourn was a member of Pi Sigma Eta as well as Epsilon Nu Delta Fraternities. Mr. Clebourn moved to Crockett in the mid 70's to take over the operation of the family-owned funeral home.

Mr. Clebourn passed away Wednesday, August 22, 2007 at ETMC Tyler.

Mr. Clebourn was a very faithful member of St. Luke Baptist Church where he served as deacon, Trustee, men's Sunday school teacher, male Chorus member, and Cubmaster for Pack 471. Mr. Clebourn also hosted a radio program called "The Brother's Gospel Hour" throughout his duration.

In addition to his Christian services, he undertook many civic duties, served as a City Councilman, as Mayor Pro

Tem and as a Precinct 3 Commissioner candidate.

Mr. Clebourn served as vice-chairman of the Davy Crockett District of the East Texas Area Council and was on the board of directors of the Deep East Texas Council of the Boy Scouts of America, county representative of the Deep East Texas Mental Health-Mental Retardation organization and chairman of the city Planning and Zoning Commission, and help organize and served as president of the Houston County Chapter of the Texas Small Farmers and Ranchers Community-Based Organization (CBO) and was a lifetime member of the Landowners Association of Texas (L.A.T.).

Mr. Clebourn lived by this philosophy: "Through this toilsome world, alas! Once and only once I pass; If a kindness I may show, if a good deed I may do to a suffering fellow man, Let me do it while I can. No delay, for it is plain I shall not pass this way again.

Mr. Clebourn was married to Joyce L. Webb. To this union four children were born. After moving to Crockett, he married Mattie Mitchell.

He leaves to cherish his memory a wife: Mattie Clebourn, of Crockett; four daughters: Denise L.
