Mr. Woodrow Lewis, age 87 of Crockett, passed away Tuesday, February 27, 2007 in the Houston County Nursing Home. Mr. Lewis was born January 29, 1920 in Hartshorn, Missouri and was a resident of Crockett since 1973. Mr. Lewis was a veteran of the U. S.
