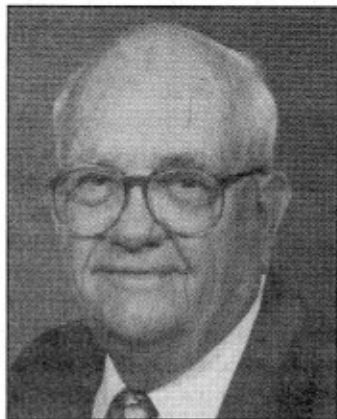


## James C. "Jim" Shoultz
