Mr. Stuart was born to Louis and Fay Keeton Stuart on September 8, 1929 in San Antonio, Texas. Along with his parents, he spent his early years on his grandparent: ranch 30 miles from Sonora

Texas. In 1942, his family moved to Bryan where he graduated from Stephen F. Austin High School. After completing his freshman year at Texas A&M Lynn joined the U.S. Army for one year. Mr. Stuart then returned to his beloved Texas A&M to continue his education and served

in the Ross Volunteers as the Executive Officer. After graduating in 1952 with a degree in Civil Engineering and receiving his commission as a 2<sup>nd</sup> Lt., Lynn served two more years in the U.S. Army. Mr. Stuart then joined the U.S. Army Reserves, serving 35 years in the 420th Engineering Brigade, retiring with the rank of Brigadier General. During this time he received the Legion of Merit and the Distinguished Service Medal.

In 1957, Mr. Stuart became a business partner with Mrs. B.F. Vance and Frank Thurmond, that later became Bryan Construction. Later Frank and Lynn added Larry Ridgway and Bob Gilliland as partners.

Mr. Stuart was a volunteer in many different groups in this area. One of his favorite pastimes was traveling and made many trips with dear friends of all ages whom he

greatly cherished.

Survivors include his wife of 50 years, Sylvia Stewart Stuart; daughter Sharon and husband Kirk Brenner, of Crockett; son Scott and wife Leticia Duran Stuart and their children Sarah, Stephen and Robert Stuart, all Houston; sister-in-law Pat of and her husband Ken Sherry, Bryan; of brother-in-law Chuck Stewart and his wife Marcia, of New Braunfels: and many nieces, nephews, greatnieces and great-nephews.
