John Chiles Affen Succumbs in Austin

John Chiles Allen, a longtime Austin resident, passed away on May 29, 2000, after a short illness. He was born on October 24, 1913, in Grapeland to John and Mary Kate Chiles Allen.

Mr. Allen earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Architecture from Texas A&M University in 1937.
