## GLENN JOSEPH COOK

Funeral services for Glenn Joseph Cook 79, of Granbury were set for Sunday, December 9, 2001 at 2:00 p.m. at All Faiths Chapel on the campus of Texas A&M University, College Stations. Burial was at the College Station City Cemetery. Mr. Glenn Joseph Cook was born March 5, 1922 at Bazette, Navarro County, Texas.
