Mrs. Jeanette Creath Crell was born April 10, 1906 in Houston County to Moffett Baskin Creath and Mary Maude Steed Creath. After finishing the teacher preparatory course at Sam Houston State Teacher's College, she taught in Houston County at Tadmor, Hickory Creek, and Salt Branch Schools.

From 1935 to 1945 she was a teacher at the State School for the Deaf in Austin, where she taught her students both to sign and to lip-read. Mrs. Crell received teaching degrees from Sam Houston State Teachers' College and from the University of Houston.

Mrs. Crell organized classes for the deaf in the Houston Independent School District, where she also taught Special Education. Mrs. Crell finished her remarkable 50-year teaching career in Houston County at Glover and Kennard, teaching Special Education. Mrs. Crell was a member of the First Presbyterian Church of Crockett, the Retired Teachers Association, the DAR, and the Pythian Sisters.
