

# Jimmie Price Davis

BAYTOWN - Services for Jimmie Price Davis, 81, a long-time resident of Mont Belvieu and former resident of Trinity, were held at 10 a.m. Tuesday, March 7, 2006, at the Navarre Funeral Home in Baytown with the Rev. James Mills officiating.

Burial followed in the Memory Gardens on Garth Road in Baytown.

Mrs. Davis died Friday, March 3.

Born Oct. 27, 1924, in Midway, she was the daughter of Perry A Price Sr. and Essie May Hooser Price. She was named in honor of Gov. Jim Ferguson, the only Texas governor to be impeached by the state legislature.

She grew up in Trinity, helping her mother rear her six brothers and sisters. Her first job, at the age of two, was to rock her brother's cradle and entertain him while her mother sewed.

One of Mrs. Price's fondest memories was making cookies for her siblings and watching them disappear as soon as they came out of the oven.

She graduated from Trinity High School in 1942 and was married to Auther Brown Davis on July 2 of the same year.

The couple lived in Mont Belvieu before moving to Galveston where Mr. Davis was stationed at Fort Crockett and Camp Wallace. After World War II, the couple settled in Mont Belvieu to raise their three children.

Mrs. Price was active in the Mont Belvieu Assembly of God Church, where she taught adult Sunday school classes and made floral arrangements using flowers grown in her yard.

Following Mr. Price's retirement, the couple moved to Old River where they attended the Old River Assembly of God Church.

Mrs. Price was an avid gardener, accomplished fisherwoman and was the chief camp house support for her husband and grandsons during hunting season each year. Known by her family as "Metro Meme," she could always be counted upon for Friday runs to the deer lease, picking up sick grand-

kids from school and retrieving forgotten book reports.

She was preceded in death by her husband of almost 60 years; an infant son, Jimmie Lewis Davis; and a grandson, Chad Ryan Davis.

Survivors include two daughters and their spouses, Sheila and Robert Talton of Pasadena and Sue and Kent Satterwhite of Baytown; a son and his spouse, Auther B. and Delainia Davis Jr. of Knoxville, Tenn.; a sister, Marjorie Mangum; two brothers, Dean Price and Perry A. Price Jr.; two sisters-in-law, Marie Davis Fisher and Mildred Davis Black; 11 grandchildren and their spouses, Dr. Melissa and Eric Hunt, Melinda and Ronald Barnes, Christina Talton, John A. and Angela Davis of Plano, Clay and Tammy Campbell, Cassie and Alan Delgado, Barbara and Frank Frey, Bill Satterwhite, Kari and Michael Robinson, Susan Satterwhite and Kelly Satterwhite; 11 great-grandchildren; and a number of nieces and nephews.
