## James Herman Driskell

Mr. James Herman Driskell, 64, of Rt. 3, Crockett, died Friday evening at the Trinity Memorial Hospital.

Mr. Driskell was born in Trinity County on March 9, 1906, but had lived here for the last 14 years. He was a member of the Latexo Baptist Church. He was a veteran of World War II.

Funeral services were held at 2 p.m. Sunday in the Latexo Baptist Church, with the pastor, Rev. C. H. Phifer, officiating. Interment was in the Evergreen Memorial Park in Crockett.
