

Marvel and Maylon Fabriguze

LIVINGSTON – Marvel Jewel Jones Fabriguze died Wednesday, March 7, 2007, after a long battle with Alzheimer’s disease. She was 83 years of age. Maylon G. “Fab” Fabriguze joined his wife on Friday, March 9, at 85 years of age having succumbed to renal failure. Maylon and Marvel enjoyed 66 years of marriage together. They were honored Sunday, March 11, with a combined memorial service at Cochran Funeral Home. They were laid to rest in Ryan Cemetery in Tarkington.

Coach “Fab” was blessed with a successful coaching and teaching career as he served at Warren High School for 11 years, West Hardin High School for six years and Corrigan-Camden High School for 10 years. During that time, Coach “Fab” was known as an outstanding coach and teacher who had the ability to love and encourage all the students with whom he worked.

Marvel was a bookkeeper most of her working life. Much of her career she worked with Allison Pole Co. of Woodville and later of Warren. She was known as a diligent and competent worker until Alzheimer’s disease forced her retirement about 14 years ago. Both Marvel and Maylon will be remembered for the magnificent way they impacted the lives of the people around them.

They are survived by two children, Irene Fabriguze and husband Mo of Pueblo, Colo. and Bill Fabriguze and wife Janey of Hardin; three grandchildren, Mindy Fabriguze Ekeroth and husband Jason of Ft. Worth, Cindy Garcia Turner and husband Chad of Spring and Jana Fabriguze Beard and husband Micah of The Woodlands and seven great-grandchildren, Garrett, Emily and Jacob Ekeroth, Adam and Alex Turner and Grace and Benjamin Beard.
