No one reported seeing the mishap occur and the wrecked car was discovered by passerby who summoned assistance. The mishap occurred around 3:30 a.m.

Funeral services were held from the Pollok Baptisst Church at 2 p.m. Sunday, with Rev. Johnnie Webber, pastor of the Crockett Church of God, officiating. Burial followed in the Pollock Cemetey.
