Frisby Services Held Wednesday

Rev. Leslie Grounds and Rev. L. D. Sellers officiated at the services. Burial was in the Hayes Spring Cemetery with nephews serving as pallbearers.

Mr. Frisby was born in Woodville July 14, 1897, but had resided here most of his life. Survivors include a son, J. C. Frisby of Amarillo; father, John Frisby, Grapeland; one brother, Louie Frisby, Grapeland; a number of nieces and nephews.
