Mrs. A. N. Gammage, 75, of Rt. 1, Elkhart, died Friday, January 5, in a Palestine hospital after a long illness. Funeral services were held Sunday at Hassell & Foster Chapel, Palestine, with the Rev. David Hill and the Rev. Mike Edens officiating. Burial followed in Pilgrim Cemetery.

Grandsons served as pallbearers.

Mrs. Gammage was born in Hope, Ark., on July 20, 1897, to Evan A. and Ida Martin Campbell. She was a member of the First Baptist Church of Elkhart, and was the widow of A. N. Gammage who died Aug. 29, 1972.
