## Katherine Lipscomb Gay

TRINITY -- Memorial services for Katherine Lipscomb Gay, 93, of Trinity were held at 11 a.m. Wednesday, Jan. 10, 2001, in the First Presbyterian Church of Trinity with the Rev. Jackie Hanna officiating.

Burial followed in the Cedar Grove Cemetery in Trinity.

Mrs. Gay died Jan. 2, 2001, in Trinity.

She was born July 29, 1907 in the Saron Community. After graduating from high school, she attended Hollins College in Roanoke, Va., and the University of Texas.

Mrs. Gay was a professional secretary and held some interesting positions during her career. She was the secretary for the commanding

general for the World War II German prisoner of war camp in Riverside and served with the Works Progress Administration (WPA) which was created to help unemployed people during the Great Depression of the 1930s.

She also was employed by the Sam Houston State University Music Department the head coach for the University of Arkansas and by the late Dr. Sam Barnes of Trinity.

She was known as an artistic and talented seamstress, making costumes for dance classes. She enjoyed music and animals, especially puppies and kittens.

Survivors include a daughter, Katherine Gay Lederer of Springfield, Mo.; a brother, William Lipscomb of Huntsville; two grandchildren, Geoffery and Susan; one niece, Joan; and two nephews, Thomas and Patrick.
