AUSTIN – A memorial service for Pauline McCoy Green, 76, was held at 10 a.m. Saturday, March 11, 2006, in the University Christian Church in Austin.

A service of committal was held at 3 p.m. Sunday, in the chapel of the University Christian Church in Fort Worth.

Mrs. Green died Sunday, March 5, in Houston after a battle with cancer.

Born Oct. 4, 1929, in Trinity, she was the eldest daughter in a family of 10 children born to Gladys Dunnam and John William McCoy. In 1952 she met and married her best friend, Leslie Green, and shared in his ministry as he served as pastor in several Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) congregations in Australia and Texas.

She attended college at Texas Christian University early in her marriage, but did not finish her degree until many years later. At the age of 58, she enrolled at Texas A&M University – Texarkana, and completed her degree, graduating cum laude.

She was known as a wonderful wife, mother, grandmother, mother-in-law, daughter, sister, aunt and friend. She also touched many lives in her roles as a volunteer hospital chaplain, Sunday school teacher, community volunteer and early childhood teacher.

Survivors include her husband; four children, Rod, Steven, David and Kathy; and five grandchildren, Harrison and Charlie Green, Zoe Green, Katie and Grace Golson.
