

Mrs. Fannie Rebecca Harkins

Funeral services were held at 2 p.m. Monday, March 20, for Mrs. Fannie Rebecca Harkins, 88, of Kennard, who died in a Crockett hospital Sunday, March 19, following an extended illness.

Officiating ministers were the Reverends Warren Hall and Dr. Everett Frey of Crockett and Frank Oswald of Kennard. Interment was in the Corinth Cemetery, and pallbearers were Dr. M. C. Harkins, Bobby Sam Harkins, John Ervin Vickers, Smith Allen Vickers, Charles Vickers, and Tommy Sims.
