

## Mrs. Lucindia Elizabeth Harper

Mrs. Lucindia Elizabeth Harper, 82, died Wednesday, May 10, at West Manor Nursing Home in Crockett after an extended illness.

Born in Weches on Dec. 26, 1878, Mrs. Harper had lived most of her life in Dallas. She was the daughter of the late James Denton English, and granddaughter of one of Texas' pioneers, Captain John English, hero and survivor of the Texas Revolution and member of the Congress of the Republic.

Mrs. Harper is survived by one son, J. F. Kenp of Dallas; and ten nieces andnephews, all children of her sister, the late Mrs. V. B. Tunstall.

Funeral services were held at 3 p.m. Thursday, May 11, from the Callaway Memorial Chapel with the Rev. Ronald Chandler, pastor of the Central Baptist Church of Crockett, officiating. Interment was in the Evergreen Memorial Park.
