Church in Trinity. While married. they attended Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary in Fort Worth.

After his early death in 1941, Mrs. Herrington moved to Houston where she taught for six years at J.W. Oates Elementary School. When the Houston Independent School District opened Roland P. Harris Elementary School in 1949, she became its first principal.

In 1956 she opened the Charlotte B. Allen Elementary and in 1962 she opened James Butler Bonham Elementary. She retired from HISD after 45 years of service.

Mrs. Herrington was known as a devoted educator who believed that all children could learn. She was a member of HART, TRTA and Delta Kappa Gamma. She also was a longtime member of the First Baptist Chines deignts.

She was preceded in death by her parents; her husband; and three brothers, Ernest Gassiott, Elmer Gassiott and Carl Gassiott.
