Dr. Kathleen Patricia Hoff, age 73 of Crockett, passed away Wednesday, July 26, 2000 in the East Texas Medical Center Crockett. Dr. Hoff was born April 29, 1927 in Chicago, Ill. is the oldest daughter of Fredrick Rupert Emden Swithen Hardy and Kathleen Cleola Heilman Hardy. She graduated from high school in Auburn, Ind. In 1945, received her Bachelors degree in 1951 from Ball State University, Muncie, Ind. And her Masters and Doctors degrees by 1964. Dr. Hoff completed many post-doctoral programs from Bowling Green University, Ohio, Sam Houston State University, and Texas A & M University.

Dr. Hoff joined the Church in 1964 and had been a Sunday school teacher, Chairman of the Executive Board of Directors, State Representative to National Conference, youth leader, College Organization sponsor, Texas Prison Outreach, and many other posts.
