TANTO LATE Mr. William Davis Houghton, age 88 of Crockett, passed away Friday, May 7, 2004 in the Whitehall Nursing Center. Mr. Houghton was a graduate of RCA Institutes and joined RCA's communications research facility at Rocky Point, L.I., in 1940, where he took an active part in the development of the RCA color television special Aster trans-

to Princeton in he helped to develop the color video tape system used to broastcast prerecorded signals over commercial TV stations. Mr. Houghton also headed a group that developed "Homefax," a television facsimile message system. More recently, he headed the research on a system for sending still TV pictures over telephone networks, which was the basis for the RCA globecom Videovoice system. Mr. Houghton was named Head of Consumer Systems Research in 1969, and since 1976 was in charge of Special Projects Research. Mr. Houghton retired from Video Systems Research with more than 38 years of service and was a member of the First Presbyterian Church.

Survivors include his wife of 62 years Margarent S. Houghton, of Crockett; daughter Heather Bixby, of Crockett; numerous other relatives.
