GROVETON – A memorial service for Larry Ingram was held Saturday, July 28, 2007, at Trinity County's Bennett Cemetery in Apple Springs. Brother Lester McAdams officiating and the eulogy was given by Michelle Lockhart, cousin. Mr. Ingram's ashes were interred in the Ingram Family plot.

Robert Larry Ingram, 60, died Monday, July 16, 2007, in a Wisconsin hospital. He was born Oct. 7, 1946 in Lufkin to parents James Robert "Sonny" and Mary Kathryn Alexander Ingram and grew up in the Houston Heights. Mr. Ingram called Houston home most of his life.

As a child he enjoyed spending time at the Trinity County home of his paternal grandparents, John Edgar and Lillie Roach Ingram, known to their eight grandchildren as "Heavy Daddy" and "Goodmama." He was especially close to cousin John Edward "Johnny" Hollis. The two boys were born less than one day apart at a Lufkin hospital, with Larry being the oldest, born on Oct. 7 and Johnny on the 8th.
