Dr. Thomas Harrington Johnson, Jr. was born September 4, 1918. Dr. Johnson was the second of five sons born to Iona Fay King Johnson and Thomas Harrington Johnson, Sr. Dr. Johnson passed away peacefully on January 8, 2002 at Abbott Northwestern Hospital, at age of 83. They married in 1944 and both went to Liberia, West Africa, where Dr. Johnson continued his work in the area of treating and trying to eliminate malaria. Dr. Johnson received an Honorable Discharge from the U.S. Army, with the Commission of Second Lieutenant. Dr. Johnson attended the Minnesota University's Medical School, he did his Residency at Mount Sinai Hospital. After gradu-. ating from Medical School, he was the Attending Physician at the Stillwater State Prison. By 1957 Dr. Johnson started what became a successful private medical practiced. Dr. Johnson practiced medical in Minneapolis for almost 35 years. As his practice grew he established Plymouth Avenue Medical Center, a thriving medical clinic employing up to as many as 30 employees, including physicians and professional staff. His clinic included specialists in General Medicine, Internal Medicine, Gynecology, Physical Therapy, Radiology, Dentistry, a Pharmacy and Diagnostic Laboratory.

Dr. Johnson was preceded in death by his mother and father, two brothers, and his wife of 55 years.

Dr. Johnson is survived by his children and family members who love him, Thomas III (Ivory), Henry (Andrea), Richard, Linda, Sharon, Beth Ann Balenger (Charles), Steven Childs; brothers and sisters, Ira Lewis, Richard, Harvey, Verna Walker, and Carrie V.
