## HOMERIACY CALLAWAYTONES

Homer Lacy Callaway Jones, age 92 of Bryan, passed away Sunday afternoon, July 2, 2000 in Bryan. Born March 28, 1908 in Palestine, she was the daughter of Sallye Rainey Lacy and C. Homer Callaway and the great-granddaughter of Col. Alexis T. Rainey, CSA. She graduated from Crockett High School, attended CIA (now, North Texas State), and Texas University (UT), and received her Bachelor of Science Degree from Sam Houston State Teachers College (SHSU) Following her graduation she taught public school in Houston County and Garland.

In 1945, she became a licensed funeral director and returned to Crockett, to work in the family business, Callaway Funeral Home. In 1953, she moved to Bryan, where she cofounded. Callaway-Jones Funeral Home. She was the first licensed female funeral director to practice in Brazos County. In 1955, during the 109th Annual Convention of the Texas. Funeral Directors Association, she was honored for having been a licensed funeral director in Texas for over 50 years. She was very proud of her family's heritage and long tradition in funeral service and the fact that ten immediate family members became licensed funeral directors, spanning four generations. At one time her family was the berest family of licensed funeral directors in the state.

Mrs. Jones voluntenced bar time freely and was involved in numerous organizations. She was a member of the Business and Professional Women's Assoc., The A & M Garden Club, OPAS, and the Knife and Fork Club. She was also a member of Order of the Eastern Star, Chapter 222, Past Worthy Matron of College Station Chapter #1026, O.E.S., and was a sponsor of the Rainbow Girls. In 1999, she received recognition of her 50 years as an Eastern Star member, She was a member of the Daughters of the American Revolution, The Daughters of the Republic of Texas, The Daughters of the Confederacy, and also has served as Memorial Chairman for the Brazos County Heart Association to many years. She was a very golden member of the First United Accept Church

of Bryan, the United Methodist Women, and was long-time teacher of the neighborly Sunday school class.

Mrs. Jones was preceded in death by her husband Manely W. Jones in 1979 and two brothers Lester and Herbert Callaway.

Survivors include two sons and daughter-in-laws Raymond

Callaway Jones and wife Dian of Bryan, Rev. Manley W. Jones, Jr. and wife Mary of Moselle, Mass.; brother Ramon Callaway of Crockett; two sisters Anne Hatfield and Sally Jean Callaway, both of Bryan: four grandchildren Michael (Mike) and Lorene Jones of Bryan, Raymond and Gina Jones of Tampa, Fla., Heather Jones of Miami Fla., and Cheryl Jones of Dallas; two greatgrandsons Cody D.
