

JAMES CECIL KILLGORE

Mr. James Cecil Killgore, age 91 of Port Arthur passed away peacefully at his home on Easter Sunday, April 20, 2003.

Born in Lisbon, Louisiana on August 9, 1911. Mr. Killgore was married to Sadie Vion Chandler on August 6, 1938. To this union was born a set of twin daughters and a son. Mr. Killgore was elected as constable of Claiborn Parish, where he served for several years, before moving his family to Port Rev.
