LUFKIN - Services for Louis Dean Leggett, 71, of Lufkin were held at 1 p.m. Saturday, Dec. 3, 2005, in the Gipson-Metcalf Funeral Home Chapel in Lufkin with the Rev. David Craig and David Boyd officiating.
