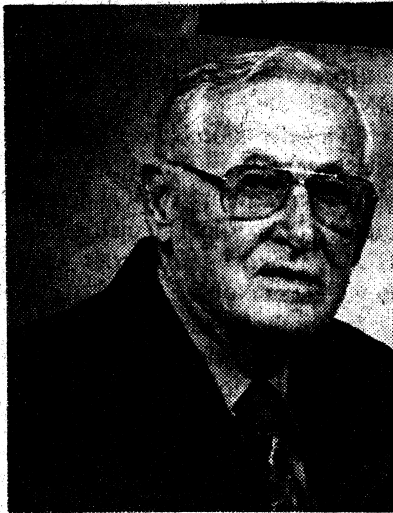

MARKS**

Glover Murphy Marks, age 87 of Lovelady, passed away Sat. July 1, 2000 at his residence surrounded by his family.

Mr. Marks was born March 15, 1913 in Houston County and grew up in the Pearson Chapel community where he met Gladys Huntsman. They married in 1934 and moved to Houston. During World War II, Mr. Marks served in the army in the 3513 Ordnance M A M Co. He worked for the Southern Pacific Railroad for 33 years before retiring as Chief Special Agent in 1978. He was preceded in death by his wife of 54 years.

Mr. Marks led a very Christian life and was a member of Antioch Baptist Church. His hobbies were traveling and caring for his yard. He enjoyed genealogy and published a book on the Marks family. He was very active in the community and a 50 year member of the Masonic Lodge. He was a councilman for the city of Lovelady for a number of years before becoming the Mayor of Lovelady in 1996.

Mr. Marks married again in 1990 to Doris Huntsman. They enjoyed 10 years of happiness together until his death following a lengthy illness. He was a devoted father to all his children, especially Charles Ray Marks, his special son. He was known for his kind and generous spirit and was loved and respected by all who knew him. He will be greatly missed.

Survivors include wife Doris Marks of Lovelady; sons Charles Ray Marks of Lovelady Steve Marks of Houston; daughter Janet Clark and husband Mark of Houston; three grandchildren Wesley Marks and wife Stephanie of Houston, Laura Marks of Houston and Mary Ann Clark of Houston, many nieces, nephews and close friends.
