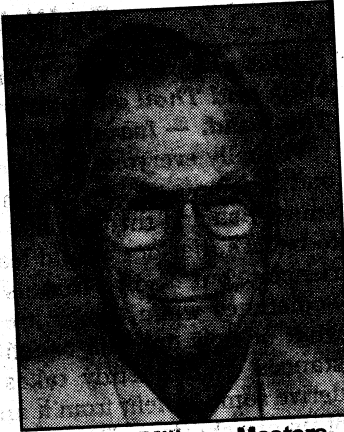

Mr. Masters passed away on March 25, 2007. He was born in East Texas May 10, 1923, the fourth of six children born to Frank Masters and Asia (Ellis) Masters. He grew up in Grapeland, Texas, where he played football, was active in F.F.A. and as a senior received the American Legion Award. He also met the girl who became the love of his life, Milly Cheatham.

After graduating in 1941, Mr. Masters moved to Houston, where he worked until the onset of World War II. He enlisted in the Navy and proudly served in the Pacific Campaign. Upon his return from the war, he married Milly September 6, 1945.
