Mr. Byron Alexander Maxwell, Jr., age 82 of Grapeland, passed away Thursday, January 18, 2002 at his residence. Mr. Maxwell was on the USS Rampo about 300-500 yards from the Arizona and other battleship. Mr. Maxwell received the Pearl Harbor Survivor Medal. Good Conduct Medal.

Mr. Maxwell was co-founder and co-owner of the Grapeland Nursing Home.
