James Olney McLean

Mr. James Olney McLean, 64, retired rural mail carrier and prominent farmer and rancher, died in a local hospital Thursday, Dec. 22, after a short illness.

A veteran of World War I, Mr. McLean was born in Houston County on Jan. 16, 1896. He was a member of the Christian Church.

Funeral services were held at 11 a.m. Saturday, Dec. 24, in the Callaway Memorial Chapel with the Reverends C. A. West, A. S. Lee, and Bill Robinson officiating. Interment was in the Evergreen Memorial Park. Pallbearers were James William McLean, Will McLean, George E. McLean, Bobby Lane, Tom Rhoden, and West Lawson Jr.

Mr. McLean is survived by his wife, Mrs. J. O. McLean; two daughters, Miss Dorothy Ellen McLean, and Mrs. Donn Currey; two brothers; William McLean and Harry McLean; and two grandchildren, all of Crockett.
