The Reverend Marshall E. McQueen, a faithful servant of God, was perfected in life to eternal life on December 17, 2002. A celebration of his life were held 2:00 p.m. Thursday at First United Methodist Church in Marlin with Dr. Ernest Phifer and the Rev. Mike Efird officiating. Interment followed at Waco Memorial Park.

Reverend Marshall was born in Latexo, on June 6, 1934. On October 1, 1954 he married Coy Mae Cliburn. In 1957 he felt the call to the ministry and began his lifetime service to God.
