Mrs. Eslie Barron Monzingo, age 96, of Lovelady, passed away March 29, at her residence. Mrs. Monzingo was born April 12, 1902 in Trinity to J.J. and Naomi Barron. She moved to Holly at a very early age and moved to Lovelady when she was 16 years old.
