LUFKIN – Funeral services for Loretta Moody, 67, of Lufkin were held Saturday, March 24, 2007, in the Denman Avenue Baptist Church, with the Rev. Charles Roberts and the Rev. Steve Shirley officiating. Interment followed in Attoyac Cemetery in San Augustine County.

Mrs. Moody was born March 22, 1939 in the Attoyac community of San Augustine County to Edna L. Thompson Wall and Travis S. Wall, and died Tuesday, March 20, in a Houston hospital.
