Leila Maude Hall Nangle, age 95, of Pasadena, passed away Sunday, Jan. 11, 1998. Nangle was a lifelong member of the First United Methodist Church of Pasadena, a member of the Order of the Eastern Star Chapter 711, and a member of the Retired Teachers Association. She received a Master of Arts degree from the University of Texas in August of 1938, with degrees in English and Journalism. Mrs. Nangle worked in California as a censor for the government during World War II reading letters looking for possible coded messages. She was a teacher generally in English, holding positions in Glover, Augusta, Wheaton High School in Maryland, and Southmore Intermediate School in Pasadena. For five years she was the principal at George Robinson School - a Methodist Mission School in Santurce, Puerto Rico near San Juan. Mrs. Nangle retired after 30 years of teaching. She married Cyril Nangle while in Puerto Rico and moved to the Washington, D.C. area.

Survivors include her brothers, Jewell Hall of Pasadena, Stanley Hall of Houston; sisters, Clara Fuller of Lovelady, Nell Patton of Pasadena; numerous nieces, nephews, great-nieces, greatnephews and other relatives.

Funeral services for Mrs. Nangle were held Thursday, Jan. 15 at 11 a.m. in the Pasadena Funeral Chapel with the Rev. Bob Lowe officiating. An Order of the Eastern Star service followed in Pasadena. Graveside services and interment followed at 4 p.m. in the Evergreen Memorial Park in Crockett.
