STEPHEN HENRY PRICE

Stephen Henry Price was born in Quannah, Texas on October 1, 1942. After a long, progressive illness, he went to his eternal home in heaven on August 6, 2001.

He is survived by his wife, Jo Morrow Stanwood-Price; daughters Angela Preclaro Price, Kate Mitchell, and husband Nathan, and Kimberly Walley, and husband Johnny; sons Wayne Collins, and wife Charlotte, and Nathan Stanwood; mother-in-law Valera Morrow; sister-in-law Mary Morrow Hagle; brother-in-law Martin Wayne Morrow; grandchildren Daniel, Roen, Travis, Ian, Cody and Lori Anne, also known as "Tinkerbell," all of Texas.

Stephen worked for the Texas Rehabilitation Commission for a number of years and then transferred to Crockett State School.
