SUE NITE RAGUZIN

Houston County Historical Commission has received notice of the death of Mrs. Sue Nite Raguzin on April 6, 2004, at Hearthstone at the Mainland

in Texas City.

Mrs. Raguzin, a descendant of Houston County pioneers John and Lucy Stepp Nite, is remembered locally for her dedicated research of the Nites: John Edward Nite (1805-1844) and wife Lucy Stepp Nite (1807-1865). From her research, she located their gravesites in the South Sector Glenwood Crockett's Cemetery and sponsored a gravemarker for historical them. That marker was deicated in a public ceremony on June 12, 1993, as a part of Houston County's Bicentennial activities. Mrs. Sue Nite Raguzin filed her family research and other writings in the Historical Commission Library, making it available to everyone.

"Mrs. Sue Nite Raguzin became a dear co-worker though some 20 years or more of research of our history," said Eliza Bishop of the Historical Commission.
