ALICE MARIE WATERHOUSE SHINOWARA

Former Houston County resident and Senior Citizens Leader, Mrs. Alice Marie Waterhouse Shinowara, age 91, passed away Friday, June 23 in Rockville, Maryland. Burial was Thursday, June 29 in the National Cemetery in Houston.

Mrs. Shinowara was born June 26, 1914 in Louisville, Kentucky to Marie Sophia Sorenson and Cohen Russell Waterhouse and grew up in Dayton, Ohio. Here she attended Wittenbury University before graduating from Ohio State University with a Master's Degree in Social Administration. Mrs. Shinowara had worked as a youth camp counselor and later in Social Administration.

On August 8, 1941, Alice married George Y. Shinowara, Phd., in White Plains, N.Y., and turned to volunteer work in Columbus, Ohio, and Nyack, N.Y., with the Hospital League. Mrs. Shinowara's creative hobbies included crafts, sewing, oil, printing, gardening and poetry. With her husband's death in 1972, Alice moved to Houston and later to Crockett. In Crockett, she was appointed as Volunteer Director of the Senior Citizens Center, which she expanded by obtaining HUD Grants.

Survivors include her daughter Nancy Shinowara, of Rockville, Md.; sister Margaret Mason, of Lewisburg, OH; brother Andrew Waterhouse, of Lewisburg, OH; and numerous nieces and nephews.

Mrs. Shinowara will be remembered as a home owner on Houston County Lake, attending all Saints Episcopal Church and leading and participating in Senior Citizens activities.
