Rites Held In Llano For Ray Skidmore

Funeral services for Mr. Melvin Ray Skidmore of Llano were held Tuesday, July 18, in the Waldrope-Hatfield-Hawthorne Funeral Home Chapel, Llano, with Rev. Rick Cundieff officiating. Burial followed in the Llano City Cemetery.

He received his Bachelor's and Master's degree from Hardin Simmons University in Abilene. Mr. Skidmore was Superintendent of Schools in Benjamin, Texas, from 1956 until 1962 when the family moved to Alamogordo, New Mexico, where he taught math and coached football and bas-ball. He received honors as "Teacher of the Year" and fellow teachers elected him president of the New Mexico Association of Classroom Teachers. He retired from teaching in 1987.

Mr. Skidmore was a member of the First Baptist Church in Llano and had been a deacon of the Baptist church since 1967. A World War II veteran, he served in the U. S. Army. Ray Skidmore and his wife, the former Helen Ruth Littlepage, were married September 8, 1945, in Houston.

Preceding him in death were his parents; three brothers, Leo Skidmore, Russell Skidmore and Harold Skidmore; and one sister, Pauline Skidmore.
