Mr. Bobby Frank Steel, 1935-2002. In the years of our Lord February 11, 2002 Bobby departed from us to his immortal home. Born in Arbor Community, Houston County, to Frank Earl Steel and Ruby Ester Rains Steel. Attended Crockett High School highly involved in school projects and a drummer in the band. Taught Drivers Ed. 1954 Graduate. Teerage farmer, hauled cotton seed with his dad.

Mr. Steel was a licensed Cotton Ginner for Jake Caprielian and ran a grain mill for Nolan Huff. Mr. Steel was a member of the Arbor Baptist Church for his lifetime and became a Deacon in his latter years in which he was very proud. Mr. Steel married Joyce Marie Lowe on September 22, 1957 in Monahans also they lived in Houston County for six months, then working for the U.S. Post Office Department one year in Houston. Mr. Steel served in the U.S. Army from November 1958 to 1960 at Fort Hood with the 4th Armored Division, over seas duty in Ulm, Germany Specialist 4 with honor of carrying the Browning Automatic Rifle, receiving the Good Conduct Medal and a badge for being an expert infantryman. Mr. Steel belonged to the 51st infantry. Finishing his retirement with the U.S. Post Office as a Spec. 5, he moved back to Houston County where he returned to cattle raising and enjoying farming small Country life once again. Also, he worked as chemist his last few jobs. Belonging to the Houston County Historical Commission, he was compelled to see a historical marker in Arbor Community.

Steel, of Crockett; children and grandchildren Bryan Harlan Steel, and former wife Helen, and daughters Heather and Tiffany, of Crockett, Judy Ann Curry, and husband Mike, and daughter Shelley Annette, of Kennard, Rev.
