Mr. Victor C. Sumner, age 79, of Spring, passed away recently. Mr. Sumner was born Jan. 23, 1920, in Spring.

Mr. Sumner attended the Junction City public schools. In 1938 he began his college career at A & M College in Magnolia, Ar.
